There were listening sessions this fall across the state about this issue and voters expressed their concerns. It seems the House did not take this into consideration when making their decision. They made a decision to benefit themselves and not their constituents. Shouldn't our lawmakers be basing their decisions from both Republican and Democrat constituents?
