HB1 Language for FY24/25

- □ To be added to HB1 Footnotes:
 - Department of Education; Appropriations. The appropriations budgeted in class 028-transfers to general services shall not be transferred or expended for any other purpose, except any portion can be transferred to class 048-contractual maintenance building & grounds or class 103-contracts for operational services; with authority to create class 048 and class 103 in any accounting unit, as needed.

Additional Federally Funded Grant

- Add new federally funded grant approved by the Fiscal Committee on 11/18/22 and Governor and Council on 11/22/22.
 - Stronger Connections Grant of \$4.8M to provide students with safer and healthier learning environments.
 - □ Grant awarded for the period 9/15/22 9/30/25

Additional Capital Budget Funds Requests

- Both CTE Center projects are requesting additional funds due to projected increases in construction costs.
 - Newport CTE Center increase of \$1,500,000; from \$11M to \$12.5M.
 - Winnisquam CTE Center increase of \$970,554; from \$6,679,109 to \$7,649,663.
