Summary of testimony presented:

Rep. Graham

- Rep. Graham introduced the bill and stated that he did not have much to add since the committee had already heard from all of the agencies and Chris Shea went over the House passed capital budget in detail.
- He did want to note that the House committee is concerned about the amount of money we are spending on IT through bonding. It currently makes up 28% of this capital budget. He said the legislature is bonding software that may not last 20 years.
- He also noted there is the section about projects that should be funded, if possible, if additional federal funds become available. The top three House priorities for those items are the forensic psychiatric hospital, the Littleton campus for the community college and the tramway replacement. He said any other projects that we can bring forward would also be appreciated. Commissioner Goulet mentioned that any multiyear projects we can fund with federal dollars would enable us to do more in future biennia.

Senator Reagan said he shared Rep. Graham's concern about the tremendous cost of what might be temporary software.
