AN ACT establishing a committee to study the solid waste practices of state agencies.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Committee Established. There is established a committee to study the recycling and solid $\mathbf{2}$ waste management practices of state agencies. 3 2 Membership and Compensation. 4 I. The members of the committee shall be as follows: (a) Three members of the house of representatives, appointed by the speaker of the $\mathbf{5}$ 6 house of representatives. 7 (b) One member of the senate, appointed by the president of the senate. 8 II. Members of the committee shall receive mileage at the legislative rate when attending to 9 the duties of the committee. 10 3 Duties. The committee shall: 11 I. Review recycling and solid waste management practices of state agencies to better 12conform with the state solid waste hierarchy in RSA 149-M with a view to the reduction of solid 13waste, increasing reuse and recycling, and decreasing food waste. 14II. Review state procurement laws and rules associated with such laws, if appropriate, and 15recommend changes to increase recycled content requirements and reduce waste. 16III. Review and recommend changes to state laws to reflect current solid waste challenges 17and opportunities, and to coordinate decentralized state agency solid waste disposal with centralized 18recycling efforts. 19IV. Review the compliance of the department of administrative services with the 20performance audit of the statewide recycling program. 214 Chairperson; Quorum. The members of the study committee shall elect a chairperson from 22among the members. The first meeting of the committee shall be called by the first-named house 23member. The first meeting of the committee shall be held within 90 days of the effective date of this 24section. Three members of the committee shall constitute a quorum. 255 Report. The committee shall report its findings and any recommendations for proposed 26legislation to the speaker of the house of representatives, the president of the senate, the house 27clerk, the senate clerk, the governor, the chairs of house and senate committees on executive 28department and administration and the state library on or before November 1, 2022. 296 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
