HOUSE BILL 1483

AN ACT relative to the use of physical force by a law enforcement officer.

### **ANALYSIS**

This bill amends the circumstances under which a law enforcement officer may legally use deadly force. The bill also repeals the legal presumption of reasonableness when a law enforcement officer uses deadly force in effecting an arrest.

AN ACT relative to the use of physical force by a law enforcement officer.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1	1 Physical Force in Law Enforcement. Amend RSA 627:5, II to read as follows:
2	II. A law enforcement officer is justified in using deadly force only when [he reasonably
3	believes such force is] reasonably necessary:
4	(a) To defend himself, herself, or a third person from [what he reasonably believes is]
5	the imminent use of deadly force; or
6	(b) To [effect an arrest or] prevent the escape from custody of a person [whom he
7	reasonably believes] who:
8	(1) Has committed or is committing a felony involving the use of force or violence, is
9	using a deadly weapon in attempting to escape, or otherwise indicates that [he] the person is likely
10	to seriously endanger human life or inflict serious bodily injury unless apprehended without delay;
11	and
12	(2) [He had] The officer made reasonable efforts to advise the person that he or she
13	is a law enforcement officer [attempting to effect an arrest and has reasonable grounds to believe]
14	and that the person is aware of [these facts] this fact.
15	(c) Nothing in this paragraph constitutes justification for conduct by a law enforcement
16	officer amounting to an offense against innocent persons whom [he] the officer is not seeking to
17	[arrest or] retain in custody.
18	2 Repeal. RSA 627:5, VIII, relative to the use of deadly force by a law enforcement officer in
