Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

State Board of Education; Rulemaking; Federal Provisions. RSA 186:6 is repealed and
reenacted to read as follows:
186:6 Compliance With Federal Provisions. Administrative rules of the state board which are

adopted under RSA 541-A to implement federal law shall take into account the fiscal impact and administrative burdens to school districts. The state board shall not adopt administrative rules that require a school district to comply with a federally mandated curriculum or program of study not fully funded by federal or state funds. The provisions of this section shall not apply to rules of the state board adopted prior to the effective date of this section.

9 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
