ANALYSIS

This bill requires that a notice of driver's license revocation or suspension be sent by first class mail when a summons was not hand delivered by a law enforcement officer. This bill also creates a presumption of service 3 days after the mailing of the notice.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 Suspension or Revocation for Default. Amend RSA 263:56-a, I(d) to read as follows:

2 (d) If a defendant receives a summons in hand from a law enforcement officer, no further 3 notification to such defendant is required before the suspension of his *or her* driving privileges 4 occurs as provided in subparagraph I(c). If a defendant receives a summons in any manner other 5 than in hand by a law enforcement officer, the court or director, as applicable, shall notify such 6 defendant by [eertified mail] *first class mail* at his *or her* last known address that [his] *their* 7 driving privileges shall be suspended 30 days after the mailing of such notification. A defendant 8 *shall be presumed to have been served 3 days after mailing of the notice.*

9 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
