Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 114:1 Annulment, Divorce and Separation; Absolute Divorce, Generally; Drug and Alcohol Abuse.
- 2 RSA 458:7, VII is repealed and reenacted to read as follows:
- Will. When either party habitually abuses alcohol or drugs and has been doing so for 2 or more years together.
  - 114:2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect January 1, 2023.
