AN ACT relative to the qualified voter affidavit.

ANALYSIS

This bill repeals the qualified voter affidavit and sworn statements on registration forms for use in election day voter registration.

103 General Voter Registration; Qualified Voter Affidavit. Amend RSA 654:12, III to read as follows: 11

12III. To prove the qualifications set forth in paragraphs I and II, an applicant for registration 13as a voter must prove his or her identity to establish that the evidence used to prove age, citizenship, 14and domicile relate to the applicant. A person who has in his or her immediate possession a photo 15identification approved for use by paragraph II must present that identification when applying for 16registration. [A person who does not have an approved photo identification with him or her may establish identity through completion of the qualified voter affidavit, which shall be retained in 1718accordance with RSA 33 A:3-a, or a sworn statement on the voter registration form used starting 30 19days before an election and on election day.] Residents of a nursing home or similar facility may 20prove their identity through verification of identity by the administrator of the facility or by his or 21her designee. For the purposes of this section, the application of a person whose identity has been 22verified by an official of a nursing home or similar facility shall be treated in the same manner as the 23application of a person who proved his or her identity with a photo identification.

244 Determining Qualifications of Applicants; Sworn Statements. Amend RSA 654:12, V(a) to 25read as follows:

26(a) [The election official approving the application for registration as voter of a person 27who does not present an approved form of photo identification as proof of identity when registering, 28shall mark the voter registration form to indicate that no photo identification was presented and 29shall inform the person that, if he or she is a first-time election day registrant in New Hampshire, he 30 or she will receive a letter of identity verification.] The person entering the voter information into 31the centralized voter registration database shall determine if the person is listed in the system as 32having been previously registered in the town or ward reported by the applicant on the voter 33 registration form. If the person is a new registrant who has not been previously registered anywhere 34in New Hampshire or if the centralized voter registration database does not confirm a previous 35registration claimed on the voter registration form, the election official shall cause the record created 36 in the centralized voter registration database to indicate that the person is a new applicant in New 37 Hampshire [and that no photo identification was presented]. When municipalities enter information

on people who register on election day into the centralized voter registration database, to the extent practical applicants who are registering for the first time in New Hampshire [and who also register without presenting an approved photo identification] shall be entered first. [The person entering the voter information of election day residents into the centralized voter registration database shall cause the records to indicate if the voter executed a sworn statement on the voter registration form used starting 30 days before an election and on election day.]

5 Voter Checklists; Right to Know Exemption. Amend RSA 654:31-a to read as follows:

8 654:31-a Right to Know Exemption. The information contained on the checklist of a town or city, specifically, the name, domicile address, mailing address, town or city, and party affiliation, if 9 10any, of registered voters, except as otherwise provided by statute, is public information subject to 11 RSA 91-A. All other information on the voter registration form, absentee registration affidavit, 12[qualified voter affidavits,] domicile affidavits, affidavit of religious exemption, application for 13absentee ballot, and contact information, including but not limited to a phone number and email 14address, provided to the secretary of state or other election officials for the purpose of receiving 15information about elections shall be treated as confidential information and the records containing this information shall be exempt from the public disclosure provisions of RSA 91-A, except as 1617provided by statutes other than RSA 91-A. [Notwithstanding the foregoing, qualified voter affidavits 18are public records subject to RSA 91-A for the sole purpose of challenging an individual registering to 19vote or voting, challenging ballots to be recounted, to the extent that such ballot challenges are 20specifically authorized by law, or determining the accuracy of any qualified voter affidavit. Election 21officials and law enforcement personnel in furtherance of their official duties may access and may 22disclose information from the voter registration form, [qualified voter affidavits,] affidavits of religious exemption, absentee registration affidavits, and applications for absentee ballots, if 2324necessary to resolve a challenge to an individual registering to vote or voting, or if necessary to 25investigate or prosecute election law violations or any crime. Law enforcement access and use of 26such records for the investigation or prosecution of crimes unrelated to election law violations shall 27be limited to the records of the specific individuals who are the subject of the investigation or 28prosecution.

6 Election Procedure; Challenges; Affidavit. Amend RSA 659:30 to read as follows:
