ANALYSIS

This bill increases the amount of wages owed to an employee who died that can be paid directly to their descendants without triggering the probate process and provides gender neutral language.

AN ACT relative to payment of wages for deceased employees.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Deceased Employee; Wages. Amend RSA 275:47, I to read as follows:

 $\mathbf{2}$ I. In the event of the death of an employee, wages due [him] to the decedent by an 3 employer not in excess of [\$300] \$3,000 may upon proper demand be paid, in the absence of actual 4notice of the pendency of probate proceedings, without requiring letters testamentary or of $\mathbf{5}$ administration [in the following order of preference to descendants: In accordance with the laws of 6 intestacy for the state of New Hampshire.] with payment made in the order of distribution set 7forth in RSA 561:1. 8

2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
