Dear Attorney Frydman,

At its meeting on October 29, 2007, the Legislative Ethics Committee reviewed your request for an advisory opinion in a memorandum dated October 19, 2007. In your memorandum, you ask the Committee for an advisory opinion regarding your acceptance of a fellowship award from the Carsey Institute at the University of New Hampshire. Your inquiry states that the award includes an invitation to participate in a fellowship program that entails attendance at a three day policy leadership institute conference that will include underwriting or reimbursement of your expenses for food, travel, and lodging, and a \$1000 award.

We advise as follows: The underwriting or reimbursement relating to your attendance at the conference would clearly fall within the definition of "expense reimbursement," as defined in RSA 14-C:2, III, and your acceptance of it would be permitted provided that you report it. RSA 14-C:4.

Your acceptance of the \$1000 award is also permitted because you would be participating in discussion groups and other activities that fall within the definition of "honorarium." RSA 14-C:2, V. You will be required to report acceptance of the honorarium pursuant to RSA 14-C:4.
