AN ACT to make technical revisions relative to the health information organization corporation and relative to the membership of the health information organization board.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

23:1 Health Information Organization Corporation; Nonprofit Tax Exemption. Amend RSA 332 I:7 to read as follows:

3 332-I:7 Corporation Established. There is hereby created a body politic and corporate having a 4 distinct legal existence separate from the state and not constituting a department of state $\mathbf{5}$ government, to be known as the New Hampshire health information organization corporation [to earry out the provisions of this chapter]. The corporation is established exclusively for the 6 7charitable purposes set forth in this chapter, subject to the provisions of this chapter and 8 section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, or any successor 9 provision of the Internal Revenue Code. The corporation is hereby deemed to be a public 10instrumentality and the exercise by the authority of the powers conferred by this chapter and section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, and shall be deemed and held to be the 11 12performance of essential health information organization functions which shall, among other 13things, promote the general health of the citizens of the state of New Hampshire. The 14corporation shall be the state's designated provider of health information exchange services. The 15corporation shall be a private nonprofit corporation [and] solely in furtherance of those purposes that qualify the corporation as exempt from taxation pursuant to section 501(c)(3) of the 1617Internal Revenue Code, and shall have all the powers necessary to carry out the purposes of this chapter, and all activities of the corporation shall be conducted in a manner which is 18consistent with the requirements of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, the laws 1920of the state of New Hampshire and the bylaws of the corporation, including, but not limited to, 21the power to receive and accept grants, loans, or advances of funds from any public or private agency 22and to receive and accept from any source, contributions of money, property, labor, or any other thing 23of value, to be held, used, and applied for the purposes of this chapter. It is intended that the health 24information organization established under this chapter be a public-private partnership for the 25benefit of all the citizens of *the state of* New Hampshire. 2623:2 New Section; Health Information Organization Corporation; Disposition of Assets.
