SENATE BILL 344

ANALYSIS

This bill permits the department of resources and economic development to cut vegetation within the protected shoreland when there is a public safety concern.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 137:1 Minimum Shoreland Protection Standards. Amend RSA 483-B:9, V(a)(2)(D)(vi) to read as 2 follows:

3 (vi) Owners of lots and holders of easements on lots that were legally developed prior to July 1, 2008 may maintain but not enlarge cleared areas, including but not limited to 4 existing lawns, gardens, landscaped areas, beaches, and rights-of-way for public utilities, public $\mathbf{5}$ transportation, and public access, and may repair existing utility structures within the waterfront 6 7buffer. Conversion to or planting of cleared areas with non-invasive species of ground cover, shrubs, 8 saplings, and trees is encouraged but shall not be required unless it is necessary to meet the 9 requirements of subparagraph (g)(2) or (g)(3), or RSA 483-B:11, II. In addition, the commissioner 10 of the department of resources and economic development may order vegetation on lands or 11 properties owned by, leased to, or otherwise under the control of the department of 12resources and economic development within the protected shoreland to be cut when 13overgrowth of vegetation impairs law enforcement activities and endangers public safety. 14If such cutting will exceed that which is allowed under subparagraph (iv), the 15commissioner of the department of resources and economic development shall provide 16written notification to the department of environmental services identifying the areas to be 17cut and an explanation of the need for the cutting at least 2 weeks prior to the undertaking. 18

19 137:2 Minimum Shoreland Protection Standards. Amend RSA 483-B:9,V(b)(2)(A) to read as20 follows:

21(A) Within the natural woodland buffer of a given lot the vegetation, except 22lawn, within at least 25 percent of the area outside the waterfront buffer shall be maintained 23unaltered or improved with additional vegetation. Owners of lots legally developed or landscaped 24prior to July 1, 2008 that do not comply with this standard are encouraged to, but shall not be required to, increase the percentage of area to be maintained in an unaltered state. The percentage 2526of area maintained in an unaltered state on nonconforming lots shall not be decreased. In addition, 27the commissioner of the department of resources and economic development may order 28vegetation on lands or properties owned by, leased to, or otherwise under the control of the

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1 department of resources and economic development within the protected shoreland to be $\mathbf{2}$ cut when overgrowth of vegetation impairs law enforcement activities and endangers public safety. If such cutting will exceed that which is allowed under this subparagraph, 3 the commissioner of the department of resources and economic development shall provide 4 written notification to the department of environmental services identifying the areas to be $\mathbf{5}$ cut and an explanation of the need for the cutting at least 2 weeks prior to the $\mathbf{6}$ 7undertaking. 8 137:3 Effective Date.
