SENATE BILL 407-FN

AN ACT relative to the purchasing policy of the department of information technology, increasing the amount required for competitive bidding, and relative to the transfer of federal grant funds.

SPONSORS: Sen. Bradley, Dist 3

COMMITTEE: Finance

AMENDED ANALYSIS

This bill amends the purchasing policy of the department of information technology for computer hardware, software, and related support and maintenance services. The bill increases the amount required for competitive bidding. The bill also authorizes the transfer of certain federal grant funds.

3 XII. Developing, in concert with the department of administrative services, director of plant

4 and property management, specifications for the procurement of computer [equipment and]

5 hardware, software, related licenses, media, documentation, support and maintenance

6 services, and other related services.

7 192:2 Department of Information Technology; Purchasing Policy. The introductory paragraph of
8 RSA 21-R:8-a, I is repealed and reenacted to read as follows:

I. Purchases of computer hardware, software, related licenses, media, documentation, 9 10 support and maintenance services, and other related services that require an expenditure of \$500 or less, or that are included on an approved standards list established by the department and require 11 12an expenditure of more than \$500, up to \$5,000, may be made by an agency without the approval of 13the chief information officer or his or her designee. To ensure that the procurement is consistent with the state information technology plan, no purchase of computer hardware, software, related 1415licenses, media, documentation, support and maintenance services, and other related services, that requires an expenditure of more than \$5,000, or any such purchase that is not included on an 1617approved standards list established by the department which requires an expenditure of more than 18 \$500, up to \$5,000, shall be made by an agency without the approval of the chief information officer 19or his or her designee:

21 Amend RSA 21-I:11, I(a) to read as follows:

(a) "Supplies" shall mean all materials, equipment, printing, furniture, furnishings, and
books, of every name and nature, including computer hardware, software, related licenses, media,
and documentation, and [standard off site] support and maintenance [generally offered to the public
for such computer hardware or software] services, excluding any systems that collect or store
data off-site.

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Purchasing Approval. Amend RSA 21-I:11, III(a) to read as follows: 1

- $\mathbf{2}$ (a) When the best interests of the state would be served thereby and the purchase involves a total expenditure of not more than $[\frac{22,000}{310,000}]$ or is a purchase in an approved class; 3
- 4 192:5 Department of Administrative Services; Division of Plant and Property Management; $\mathbf{5}$ Purchasing Approval. Amend RSA 21-I:11, IV to read as follows:

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IV Except where competitive bidding has been employed, no purchase involving an $\overline{7}$ expenditure of more than $[\frac{2}{2},000]$ \$10,000 or purchase in an approved class may be made by the 8 director of plant and property management without the written approval of the commissioner. In 9 requesting such approval, the director shall first state in writing his reasons for not employing 10competitive bidding.

11 192:6 Department of Administrative Services; Division of Plant and Property Management. 12Amend RSA 21-I:11, XI-XII to read as follows:

13XI. Requiring, prior to an agency's submission of a request for purchase of computer 14hardware, software, related licenses, media, documentation, [and standard off site] support and maintenance [generally offered to the public for such computer hardware or software exceeding \$500 1516in total cost] services, and other related services that either require an expenditure of more 17than \$5,000, or involve a purchase that is not on an approved standards list established by 18 the department of information technology which requires an expenditure of more than 19\$500, up to \$5,000, that the agency obtain approval of the proposal by the chief information officer 20or his or her designee to ensure that the procurement is consistent with the state information 21technology plan.

22XII. Requiring agencies to submit the approval [from] issued under RSA 21-R:8-a, I by the 23chief information officer or his or her designee in support of requests for purchases of [information 24technology equipment or software in excess of \$500] computer hardware, software, related 25licenses, media, documentation, support and maintenance services, and other related 26services that either require an expenditure of more than \$5,000, or involve a purchase that 27is not on an approved standards list established by the department of information 28technology which requires an expenditure of more than \$500, up to \$5,000.

29192:7 New Section; Budget and Appropriations. Amend RSA 9 by inserting after section 16-b 30 the following new section:

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9:16-c Transfer of Federal Grant Funds.

32I. In order to maximize the use of federal grant funds and to avoid lapsing such funds where 33 changes in the state or federal accounting systems, changes in federal grant guidelines, or 34overestimation or underestimation of funds required in various class codes due to program needs or 35requirements have occurred subsequent to the passage of the budget, every department as defined in 36 RSA 9:1 may, subject to the prior approval of the fiscal committee of the general court and the

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1 approval of governor and council, transfer funds in or out of any class code and to create new class $\mathbf{2}$ codes within federally funded areas of the department's operating budget if such transfers do not 3 result in an over-expenditure of any grant. II. In order to maximize the use of federal grant funds and not lapse such funds, every 4 department as defined in RSA 9:1 may, subject to the approval of the commissioner of the $\mathbf{5}$ $\mathbf{6}$ department of administrative services, carry forward into future state fiscal years any budgeted 7appropriation balances in class from federal grants for the duration of the federal grant award. 8 192:8 Repeal. 2011, 224:203 and 2011, 224:204, relative to the transfer of federal funds, are 9 repealed. 10 192:9 Effective Date.
