This bill requires school boards to establish a policy enabling a high school student who takes a college course for credit to have that credit computed as part of the student's high school grade point average.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

## College Course Credit for High School Students

4 189:65 College Course Credit for High School Students. The school board of each school district
5 shall adopt a policy enabling a high school student in his or her junior or senior year to obtain credit

6 for a course taken at an accredited postsecondary educational institution in which the student earns

7 a 'C' average or higher, or its equivalent, provided that the course fulfills a high school graduation

8 requirement. The policy shall require that the college course grade shall be computed as part of the

9 student's overall high school grade point average.

10 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
