HB 363 – AS INTRODUCED

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Thirteen

AN ACT establishing a committee to study the form of the oath taken by members of the general court.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 1 Committee Established. There is established a committee to study the form of the oath taken 2 by members of the general court.
- 3 2 Membership and Compensation.
- 4

I. The members of the committee shall be as follows:

- 5 (a) Three members of the house of representatives, appointed by the speaker of the 6 house of representatives.
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(b) Three members of the senate, appointed by the president of the senate.

8 II. Members of the committee shall receive mileage at the legislative rate when attending to 9 the duties of the committee.

10 3 Duties. The committee shall study the form of the oath taken by members of the general 11 court. The committee shall include in its study whether a public acknowledgement by a notary 12 public or justice of the peace should be required and whether the current form of the written oath 13 should require separate signatures for each part.

14 4 Chairperson; Quorum. The members of the study committee shall elect a chairperson from 15 among the members. The first meeting of the committee shall be called by the first-named house 16 member. The first meeting of the committee shall be held within 45 days of the effective date of this 17 section. Four members of the committee shall constitute a quorum.

18 5 Report. The committee shall report its findings and any recommendations for proposed 19 legislation to the speaker of the house of representatives, the president of the senate, the house 20 clerk, the senate clerk, the governor, and the state library on or before November 1, 2013.

21 6 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
