ANALYSIS

This bill requires the vendors contracting with the department of health and human services for the Medicaid managed care plan to make quarterly reports to the commissioner of health and human services regarding their efforts to implement New Hampshire's 10-year mental health plan of 2008. Under this bill, the commissioner shall make an annual report summarizing the vendors' reports to the oversight committee on health and human services.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

41:1 New Subparagraph; Reports Required. Amend RSA 126-A:5, XIX by inserting after 1 $\mathbf{2}$ subparagraph (c) the following new subparagraph:

3 (d) The vendors contracting with the department to carry out the Medicaid managed 4 care program pursuant to this paragraph shall make quarterly reports to the commissioner $\mathbf{5}$ regarding their efforts to implement New Hampshire's 10-year mental health plan issued in 2008. Such reports shall commence on November 1, 2013. The commissioner shall make an annual report 6 7summarizing the information in the vendors' reports to the oversight committee on health and
