HOUSE BILL **457**

AN ACT establishing a committee to study eliminating and combining liquor licenses.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Thirteen

AN ACT establishing a committee to study eliminating and combining liquor licenses.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Committee Established. There is established a committee to study eliminating and combining
2 liquor licenses.

3 2 Membership and Compensation.

4 I. The members of the committee shall be as follows:

5 (a) Three members of the house of representatives, appointed by the speaker of the
6 house of representatives.

7 (b) Three members of the senate, appointed by the president of the senate.

8 II. Members of the committee shall receive mileage at the legislative rate when attending to
9 the duties of the committee.

10 3 Duties. The committee shall study eliminating and combining liquor licenses.

11 4 Chairperson; Quorum. The members of the study committee shall elect a chairperson from
12 among the members. The first meeting of the committee shall be called by the first-named house
13 member. The first meeting of the committee shall be held within 45 days of the effective date of this
14 section. Four members of the committee shall constitute a quorum.

15 5 Report. The committee shall report its findings and any recommendations for proposed
16 legislation to the speaker of the house of representatives, the president of the senate, the house
17 clerk, the senate clerk, the governor, and the state library on or before November 1, 2013.

18 6 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
