HOUSE BILL 504

AN ACT relative to official oppression.

SPONSORS: Rep. Itse, Rock 10; Rep. Comerford, Rock 33

COMMITTEE: Criminal Justice and Public Safety

## ANALYSIS

This bill revises the offense of official oppression by making it either a class B misdemeanor or a violation, depending on whether a public servant acted with a purpose to benefit oneself or another or to harm another.

## STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

AN ACT relative to official oppression.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 Intent. The intent of the official oppression statute is to empower citizens to hold public servants accountable in their delegated duties pursuant to the Constitution of New Hampshire, part 3 I, articles 8 and 10.
  - 2 Official Oppression. Amend RSA 643:1 to read as follows:

- I. A public servant, as defined in RSA 640:2, II, is guilty of a misdemeanor if, with a purpose to benefit [himself] oneself or another or to harm another, he or she knowingly commits an unauthorized act which purports to be an act of his or her office; or knowingly refrains from performing a duty imposed on him or her by law or clearly inherent in the nature of his or her office.
- II. A public servant, as defined in RSA 640:2, II, is guilty of a violation if, without a purpose to benefit oneself or another or to harm another, he or she knowingly commits an unauthorized act which purports to be an act of his or her office; or knowingly refrains from performing a duty imposed upon him or her by law. A complaint under this paragraph may be filed in the circuit court with jurisdiction over the municipality in which the offense occurs.
- 3 Effective Date. This act shall take effect January 1, 2014.
