HOUSE BILL 588

AN ACT extending the instream flow pilot program for 2 years and establishing a

commission to study opportunities and options to improve the sustainability of the

fish and game department.

AMENDED ANALYSIS

This bill:

I. Extends the date for completion of the instream flow pilot program for 2 years.

II. Extends the committee to study the impact of water withdrawals on instream flows.

III. Extends the commission to study water infrastructure sustainability funding for one year.

IV. Establishes a commission to study opportunities and options to improve the sustainability of the fish and game department.

I. There is established a commission to study opportunities and options to improve the
sustainability of the fish and game department.
II.(a) The members of the commission shall be as follows:
(1) Two members of the house of representatives, appointed by the speaker of the
house of representatives.
(2) Two members of the senate, appointed by the president of the senate.
(3) The director of the fish and game department, or designee.
(4) The chairman of the fish and game commission, or designee.
(5) Three public members appointed by the governor.
(b) Legislative members of the commission shall receive mileage at the legislative rate
when attending to the duties of the commission.
III. The commission shall study options and opportunities for ensuring the financial stability
and sustainability of the fish and game department. The commission may solicit information and

testimony from those with experience or expertise relevant to the study.

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IV. The members of the commission shall elect a chairperson from among the members. T	he
first meeting of the commission shall be called by the first-named house member. The first meeting	ng
of the commission shall be held within 45 days of the effective date of this section. Three members	of
the commission shall constitute a quorum.	
V. The commission shall report its findings and any recommendations for propos	ed
legislation to the speaker of the house of representatives, the president of the senate, the house	.se
clerk, the senate clerk, the governor, and the state library on or before November 1, 2013.	
241:8 Repeal. RSA 206:1-a, relative to the commission to study opportunities to improve to	he
sustainability of the fish and game department, is repealed.	
241:9 Effective Date.	
I. Section 8 of this act shall take effect November 1, 2013.	
II. The remainder of this act shall take effect upon its passage.
