10	81:3 Child Support Formula; Calculation of Self-Support Reserve. Amend RSA 458-C:3, IV(b) to

12	(b) If the obligor parent's gross income is greater than the self-support reserve but
13	payment of the [order] parental support obligation as calculated under this chapter would reduce
14	the obligor parent's adjusted gross income below the self-support reserve, the [obligor parent's
15	share of the total support obligation] presumptive child support obligation shall be [presumed to
16	be] the difference between the self-support reserve and [that] the obligor parent's adjusted gross
17	income, but in any event shall be no less than the amount of a minimum support order.
18	81:4 Effective Date. This act shall take effect upon its passage.
