ANALYSIS

This bill declares that a prescription subject to the 48-hour exception process under RSA 420-J:7-b shall be considered approved and shall be filled if the exception process exceeds the 48-hour period.

This bill is the result of the committee established in 2011, 117 as amended by 2012, 109.

Every health benefit plan that provides prescription drug benefits shall maintain an 3 expeditious exception process, not to exceed 48 hours, by which covered persons may obtain coverage for a medically necessary nonformulary prescription drug. The exception process shall begin when 4 the prescribing provider has provided the health benefit plan with the clinical rationale for the $\mathbf{5}$ 6 exception. The exception process shall begin when the prescribing provider has submitted a request with a clinical rationale for the exception to the health benefit plan. 7A 8 prescription that requires an exception for coverage shall be considered approved if the 9 exception process exceeds 48 hours. 10262:2 Effective Date.
