### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

AN ACT relative to a surviving spouse's right to retain a Purple Heart plate.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

| 1 | 178:1 Special Number plates for Certain Veterans. Amend RSA 261:86, I(d) to read as follows:          |

| 2 | (d) Was awarded the Purple Heart medal in a qualifying war or armed conflict as                       |
| 3 | defined in RSA 72:28, V, and who was honorably discharged or is still on active duty, provided that   |
| 4 | such person has furnished the director with satisfactory proof of these circumstances. A veteran      |
| 5 | furnished a Purple Heart plate while on active duty shall furnish proof of honorable discharge to the |
| 6 | director prior to the first renewal of registration following discharge. The surviving spouse shall   |
| 7 | be entitled to the plate as long as he or she lives, unless he or she remarries.                      |
| 8 | 178:2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.                           |
