STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Thirteen

AN ACT relative to the appointment of a guardian ad litem in certain sexual assault cases. Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Sexual Assault and Related Offenses; Testimony and Evidence. Amend RSA 632-A:6, V to 2 read as follows:

3 V. In any sexual assault case under RSA 632-A where the victim is 16 years of age or younger, and the defense has listed as a witness or subpoenaed a parent or parents to testify in the 4case and requested that the parent or parents be sequestered, the court [shall] may appoint a $\mathbf{5}$ 6 guardian ad litem to determine the best interests of the minor victim. If appointed by the court, 7the guardian ad litem shall make a recommendation to the court, based on the preferences and best 8 interests of the victim, as to whether the parent or parents should be permitted to sit with the victim 9 in the court room during the duration of the trial. 102 Applicability. This act shall apply to sexual assault cases initiated on or after the effective

11 date of this act.

12 3 Effective Date. This act shall take effect January 1, 2014.
