The council shall report annually on or before [November] December 1 to the 11 governor and the general court regarding the progress being made to provide services and support to 12 [ehildren and adolescents] youths with chronic [health] conditions and their families in regular 13 educational and medical environments allowing them to remain in or near their own homes and 14 communities.
