## HB 1106 - AS INTRODUCED

AN ACT relative to disqualification of moderators.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Disgualification of Moderator. Amend RSA 658:24 to read as follows:

 $\mathbf{2}$ 658:24 Disqualification of Certain Persons. Any person, other than a moderator, clerk, 3 selectman, inspector of election, or supervisor of the checklist, whose name appears on a ballot for an elective position, other than a position of an election official, shall be disqualified from performing 4duties as an election official in that election. A person so disqualified shall not be considered to have  $\mathbf{5}$ 6 vacated any office but rather only to be absent therefrom. A temporary replacement shall be 7appointed as provided in RSA 658:22. A moderator, clerk, selectman, inspector of election, or 8 supervisor of the checklist whose name appears on a ballot for an elective position, other than the 9 position of an election official, shall be disqualified from the handling of marked ballots and the 10counting of votes, except that a moderator may handle ballots that have been counted. 11 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
