Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 New Section; Hospitals to Retain Advance Directives and Living Wills. Amend RSA 151 by 2 inserting after section 21-b the following new section:

3 151:21-c Hospitals to Retain Advance Directives and Living Wills. Hospitals required to be

4 licensed under this chapter shall retain advance directives and living wills executed pursuant to

5 RSA 137-J and such directives shall be included in the patient's medical record.

6 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
