ANALYSIS

This bill establishes a commission to study manufacturing education in New Hampshire.

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STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

AN ACT establishing a commission to study manufacturing education in New Hampshire. Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened: 1 1 Statement of Intent. $\mathbf{2}$ I. Manufacturing has traditionally been New Hampshire's most important business. More 3 recently, manufacturing employment has declined and manufacturing companies now employ only about 10 percent of non-farm workers in New Hampshire. Meanwhile, the companies that are here 4 need to find well-trained workers, and a strong supply of trained workers will bring other companies $\mathbf{5}$ 6 to our state. 7II. While there are some bright spots in manufacturing education, some schools have ended 8 programs, and those with active programs have trouble motivating students to enroll. This 9 commission's charge will be to evaluate what steps and investments the government and state 10 educational institutions should take to grow the manufacturing labor pool and create more educational-industrial partnerships. 11 122 New Subdivision; Commission to Study Manufacturing Education. Amend RSA 188-E by 13inserting after section 23 the following new subdivision: 14Commission to Study Manufacturing Education 15188-E:24 Commission Established. 16I. There is established a commission to study manufacturing education in New Hampshire. 17The members of the commission shall be as follows: (a) Three members of the house of representatives, appointed by the speaker of the 18 19house of representatives. 20(b) One member of the senate, appointed by the president of the senate. 21(c) The commissioner of the department of resources and economic development, or 22designee. 23(d) The chancellor of the community college system of New Hampshire, or designee. 24(e) The president of the university of New Hampshire, or designee. 25(f) Two members employed in the manufacturing industry, appointed by the governor. (g) Two members with expertise in manufacturing education, appointed by the governor. 2627II. Legislative members of the commission shall receive mileage at the legislative rate when 28attending to the duties of the commission. 29III. The commission shall analyze the state of manufacturing education in New Hampshire 30 and develop recommendations for improvements.

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1	IV. The members of the study commission shall elect a chairperson from among the
2	members. The first meeting of the commission shall be called by the first-named house member.
3	The first meeting of the commission shall be held within 45 days of the effective date of this section.
4	Six members of the commission shall constitute a quorum.
5	V. The commission shall report its findings and any recommendations for proposed
6	legislation to the speaker of the house of representatives, the president of the senate, the house
7	clerk, the senate clerk, the governor, and the state library on or before November 1, 2014.
8	3 Repeal. The following are repealed:
9	I. Section 1 of this act relative to statement of intent on manufacturing education.
10	II. RSA 188-E:24, relative to the commission to study manufacturing education.
11	4 Effective Date.
12	I. Section 3 of this act shall take effect November 2, 2014.
13	II. The remainder of this act shall take effect upon its passage.
