HOUSE BILL 1209

AN ACT relative to On-Board Diagnostics (OBD II) testing and the OBD II testing advisory

committee.

SPONSORS: Rep. Cooney, Graf 8; Rep. Packard, Rock 5

COMMITTEE: Science, Technology and Energy

ANALYSIS

This bill modifies the membership and the meeting and reporting requirements of the OBD II testing advisory committee.

AN ACT relative to On-Board Diagnostics (OBD II) testing and the OBD II testing advisory committee.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

III. The commissioner, after public hearing and consultation with the commissioner of the department of environmental services and the air pollution advisory committee, and notification of the house science, technology, and energy committee and the senate environment committee, and with the approval of the air pollution advisory committee, shall adopt rules under RSA 541-A, which require [all model year 1996 and newer gasoline powered and model year 1997 and newer diesel-powered] motor vehicles equipped with an on-board diagnostic [systems] system meeting [the] federal EPA OBD II (On-Board Diagnostics) standards that are driven on the ways of this state and which are subject to inspection under this chapter, after a date specified by the commissioner, to be tested for OBD II indications of failures as a component of the inspection. Vehicles subject to this requirement shall include model year 1997 and newer diesel-powered motor vehicles and model year 1996 and newer motor vehicles powered by any other fuel source. To the extent allowed by EPA OBD II policy, OBD II data may be substituted for visual and functional tests required by paragraph I.

236:2 OBD II Testing Advisory Committee. Amend RSA 266:59-b, VII to read as follows:

- VII.(a) There is established an OBD II testing advisory committee. The committee shall be composed of the following:
 - (1) Three representatives, appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives.
 - (2) [Three] *Two* senators, appointed by the president of the senate.
- (3) The director of the division of motor vehicles of the department of safety, or designee.
 - (4) The attorney general, or designee.
 - (5) The commissioner of environmental services, or designee.
- (6) One member nominated by the New Hampshire Automobile Dealers Association and appointed by the governor.
- [(7) One member nominated by the New Hampshire Motor Transport Association and appointed by the governor.]
- 28 (b) Members' terms shall be coterminous with their terms in office, except that 29 [members] the member appointed pursuant to [subparagraphs (a)(6) and (a)(7)] subparagraph

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1	(a)(6) shall serve at the discretion of the appointing authority.
2	(c) The committee shall:
3	(1) Review and make recommendations on any contracts between the state and any
4	private entities relating to OBD II testing.
5	(2) Review program operations on any contracts between the state and any private
6	entities relating to OBD II testing.
7	(3) Make recommendations for statutory and rules changes to the amounts and types
8	of repair waivers granted in the OBD II testing program.
9	(4) [Report by May 1, 2006 its recommendation whether to extend the electronic
10	reporting exemption for inspection stations performing less than 200 inspections in a consecutive 12-
11	month period] Meet at least annually and more often as needed.
12	(5) Submit [an annual] a report at least biennially or as needed to the governor,
13	senate president, and speaker of the house of representatives by November 1st of odd-numbered
14	years on the operation of the motor vehicle inspection and emissions testing program.
