Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 New Paragraph; Registration of Criminal Offenders; Release into Community. Amend 2 RSA 651-B:3 by inserting after paragraph IV the following new paragraph:
- V. No political subdivision of the state shall adopt an ordinance or bylaw that restricts in any way the residence of a sexual offender or an offender against children.
 - 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
