HOUSE BILL **1331**

AN ACT relative to the membership and reporting date of the interbranch criminal and juvenile justice council and establishing a committee to study state procurement.

SPONSORS: Rep. Cushing, Rock 21

COMMITTEE: Executive Departments and Administration

AMENDED ANALYSIS

This bill:

I. Adds members to and changes the reporting date of the interbranch criminal and juvenile justice council.

II. Requires the council to review and report on the effectiveness of changes made to probation and parole procedures and to the sentencing of offenders implemented by 2010, 247.

III. Establishes a committee to study state procurement.

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STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Fourteen

AN ACT relative to the membership and reporting date of the interbranch criminal and juvenile justice council and establishing a committee to study state procurement.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 221:1 New Subparagraphs; Interbranch Criminal and Juvenile Justice Council; Membership.
2 Amend RSA 651-E:2, I by inserting after subparagraph (w) the following new subparagraphs:

3 (x) The chairman of the adult parole board, or designee.

4 (y) The executive director of the New Hampshire Coalition Against Domestic and Sexual
5 Violence, or designee.

6 221:2 Interbranch Criminal and Juvenile Justice Council; Report. Amend RSA 651-E:5 to read
7 as follows:

8 651-E:5 Report. The council shall submit [~~an annual~~] **a biennial** report beginning on
9 [~~November 1, 2008~~] **December 1, 2014**, together with its findings and any recommendations for
10 proposed legislation to the speaker of the house of representatives, the senate president, the house
11 clerk, the senate clerk, the governor, and the state library.

12 221:3 Interbranch Criminal and Juvenile Justice Council; Review of Changes to Probation and
13 Parole Procedures and Sentencing of Offenders. The interbranch criminal and juvenile justice
14 council, established in RSA 651-E, shall review the effectiveness of the changes made to probation
15 and parole procedures and the sentencing of offenders implemented in 2010, 247 (SB 500-FN) and
16 shall submit a report containing its recommendations to the speaker of the house of representatives,
17 the senate president, the house clerk, the senate clerk, and the governor no later than December 1,
18 2014.

19 221:4 Committee to Study State Procurement Established. There is established a committee to
20 study state procurement.

21 I. The members of the committee shall be as follows:

22 (a) Two members of the senate, appointed by the president of the senate, one of whom
23 shall be a member of the senate executive departments and administration committee and one of
24 whom shall be a member of the senate finance committee.

25 (b) Three members of the house of representatives, appointed by the speaker of the
26 house of representatives, 2 of whom shall be members of the house executive departments and
27 administration committee and one of whom shall be a member of the house finance committee.

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1 II. Members of the committee shall receive mileage at the legislative rate when attending to
2 the duties of the committee.

3 III. The committee shall study and develop standards and methods for a centralized system
4 of state procurement. The study shall include examination of procurement procedures of other
5 states; identification of potential conflicts within New Hampshire state procurement laws; and
6 consideration of the State of New Hampshire Service Contracting Performance Audit Report, dated
7 March 2009.

8 IV. The members of the study committee shall elect a chairperson from among the members.
9 The first meeting of the committee shall be called by the first-named senate member. The first
10 meeting of the committee shall be held within 45 days of the effective date of this section. Three
11 members of the committee shall constitute a quorum.

12 V. The committee shall report its findings and any recommendations for proposed legislation
13 to the president of the senate, the speaker of the house of representatives, the senate clerk, the
14 house clerk, the governor, and the state library on or before November 1, 2014.

15 221:5 Effective Date.

16 I. Sections 1-3 of this act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.

17 II. The remainder of this act shall take effect upon its passage.

20 Effective Date: I. Sections 1-3 shall take effect September 12, 2014.

21 II. Remainder shall take effect July 14, 2014.
