AN ACT permitting a municipal law enforcement agency to collect unwanted or illegal firearms.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 New Section; Pistols and Revolvers; Voluntarily Surrendered Firearms. Amend RSA 159 by $\mathbf{2}$ inserting after section 25 the following new section: 3 159:25-a Collection of Unwanted or Illegal Firearms by a Municipal Law Enforcement Agency. I. A city or town may adopt a policy authorizing the local police department to accept and 4 $\mathbf{5}$ collect unwanted or illegal firearms which are voluntarily surrendered. Such policy shall provide for 6 the following: 7(a) Unwanted or illegal firearms may be voluntarily surrendered at the police station or 8 another location designated by the chief of police. 9 (b) Unwanted or illegal firearms may be held at the police station or transferred to a 10location designated by the chief of police where they may be held pending sale or disposal. 11 (c) No compensation of any kind shall be paid to any person voluntarily surrendering an 12unwanted or illegal firearm. 13(d) The chief of police may offer for sale or auction any firearm that he or she determines 14to be an antique. The proceeds of the sale of such firearms shall be retained by local law enforcement agency and used for general law enforcement purposes. 1516(e) Each person voluntarily surrendering an unwanted or illegal firearm may, upon 17request, receive a copy of a receipt which describes the specific type of firearm surrendered and the 18date of surrender. 19II. No court order shall be required for the sale or disposal of firearms voluntarily 20surrendered pursuant to this section. 21III. No person who surrenders a firearm which is illegal to possess under state law shall be 22criminally prosecuted for the illegal possession of such firearm. 23IV. Nothing in this section shall require any person voluntarily surrendering a firearm to 24disclose personally identifiable information as a requirement for surrendering a firearm. 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage. 25
