This bill adds arsenic to the radon and lead paint notice sellers are required to provide buyers prior to the sale of real property.

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## STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Fourteen

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 Notification of Radon, Arsenic, and Lead Paint. Amend RSA 477:4-a to read as follows:

477:4-a Notification Required; Radon [Gas], Arsenic, and Lead Paint.

I. Prior to the execution of any contract for the purchase and sale of any interest in real property which includes a building, the seller, or seller's agent, shall provide the following notification to the buyer. The buyer shall acknowledge receipt of this notification by signing a copy of such notification:

7 "Radon [Gas]: Radon [gas], the product of decay of radioactive materials in rock may be found in

8 some areas of New Hampshire. [This] Radon gas may pass into a structure through the ground or

9 through water from a deep well. Testing can establish its presence and equipment is available to

10 remove it from the air or water.

11 Arsenic: Arsenic is a common groundwater contaminant, occurring at unhealthy levels in

12 certain areas of the state. Tests are available to determine whether arsenic is present.

13 ["]Lead Paint: Before 1977, paint containing lead may have been used in structures. The presence of 14 flaking lead paint can present a serious health hazard, especially to young children and pregnant 15 women. Tests are available to determine whether lead is present."

16 II. Nothing in this section shall be construed to have any impact on the legal validity of title 17 transferred pursuant to a purchase and sale contract in paragraph I, or to create or place any 18 liability with the seller or seller's agent for failure to provide the notification described in paragraph 19 I.

20 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect January 1, 2016.
