A RESOLUTION urging Congress to investigate the Benghazi incident. 1 Whereas, every American citizen serving in the defense of his or her country has the right and $\mathbf{2}$ the expectation to not be left behind on foreign or domestic soil; and 3 Whereas, the Secretary of State was sent 5 dispatches from Embassy Tripoli dated March 28, $\mathbf{4}$ 2012, July 9, 2012, Aug 2, 2012, Aug 20, 2012, and Sept 11, 2012, all requesting more security agents or complaining about the integrity of the local security people; and $\mathbf{5}$ 6 Whereas, there were over 125 Marines stationed in Sigonella, Italy, part of the Special Purpose 7Marine Air Ground Task Force 12, who were tasked with training African militaries fighting Africa-8 based terror groups, which were never called in to help; and 9 Whereas, the State Department's own Accountability Review Board concluded that "systemic" 10management and leadership failures at the State Department led to "grossly" inadequate security at 11 the mission in Benghazi, Libya; and 12Whereas, even those found to be culpable have suffered no consequences from their cowardly and 13despicable actions; therefore be it 14Resolved by the House of Representatives: 15That the New Hampshire house of representatives hereby calls upon its federal colleagues to 16urge immediate action by the United States Senate and United States House of Representatives to 17fully investigate the facts, including the subpoena and interrogation of any and all material 18witnesses, surrounding or relevant to the terrorist attack against the United States consulate in 19Benghazi, Libya on September 11, 2012, which resulted in the deaths of 4 Americans including U.S. 20Ambassador Christopher Stevens; and 21That copies of this resolution be transmitted by the house clerk to the President of the

22 United States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, and each member

23 of the New Hampshire congressional delegation.
