Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

19	283.:2 Snowmobiles; Speed Limits. Amend RSA 215-C:8, III(b) to read as follows:

21	subparagraph (a), the speed of any snowmobile in excess of the limit specified in this section shall be
22	prima facie evidence that the speed is not reasonable or prudent and that it is unlawful:
23	(1) 10 miles per hour within 150 feet of any so-called bob-house, fishing shanty, or

(2) [10] 20 miles per hour on class I through VI highways when the snowmobile is being operated within the rights-of-way adjacent to such highways; [town or city sidewalks;] class IV, V, and VI highways approved for snowmobile operation; and bridges open for snowmobile operation.

(3) 10 miles per hour at trail junctions or parking lots, [ex] when passing trail grooming equipment, or on town or city sidewalks.
