AN ACT establishing a commission on rural affairs.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 209:1 New Section; Commission on Rural Affairs. Amend RSA 9-A by inserting after section 4 $\mathbf{2}$ the following new section: 3 9-A:5 Commission on Rural Affairs Established. There is established a commission to study and make recommendations relating to public policy that specifically affects rural areas and rural people. 4 I. The members of the commission shall be as follows: $\mathbf{5}$ 6 (a) One member of the senate, appointed by the president of the senate. 7(b) One member of the house of representatives, appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives. 8 9 (c) Eight public members drawn from, respectively, the areas of health care, agriculture, 10 natural resources, business, public safety, telecommunications, youth services, and local 11 government, appointed by the governor. 12(d) Two members appointed by the chancellor of the university system of 13New Hampshire, one of whom shall be an employee of the UNH cooperative extension. 14One member appointed by the chancellor of the community college system of 15New Hampshire. 16II. Members of the commission shall serve without compensation. Legislative members of 17the commission shall serve a term coterminous with their term in office. Non-legislative members appointed under subparagraphs I(c), (d), and (e) shall serve for a term of 3 years, except that the 1819initial appointment of such members shall be for staggered terms of one, 2, and 3 years. No member 20shall serve more than 3 consecutive terms. 21III. The commission shall study and recommend actions: 22To expand economic and social opportunities for rural communities and their (a) 23residents. 24(b) To promote equal treatment of and effective delivery to rural areas by government agencies and the private sector. 2526(c) To assess the effectiveness of programs designed to promote rural viability. 27(d) To provide a collective voice for rural areas. 28IV. The commission shall have the authority to accept and expend funds from any public or

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- 1 private source, including private gifts, grants, and donations. The funds shall be used exclusively to $\mathbf{2}$ further the purposes of the commission, which may include the payment of mileage to members of 3 the commission. 4 V. The members of the commission shall elect a chairperson from among the members. The first meeting of the commission shall be called by the first-named senate member. The first meeting $\mathbf{5}$ of the commission shall be held within 45 days of the effective date of this section. Four members of 6 7the commission shall constitute a quorum. 8 VI. Beginning September 15, 2015, and each September 15 thereafter, the commission shall 9 submit an annual report of its findings and any recommendations for proposed legislation to at least 10 the president of the senate, the speaker of the house of representatives, the senate clerk, the house 11 clerk, the governor, and the state library. 12209:2 Effective Date.
