Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 Elections; Incompatible Offices; Executive Councilor. Amend RSA 655:10, I to read as 2 follows: 3 I. No person shall file declaration of candidacy or primary petitions for nomination at the primary for incompatible offices. For the purposes of this section, incompatible offices shall include 4 5 the offices of governor, United States senator, United States representative, representative to the 6 general court, state senator, councilor, county commissioner, county sheriff, county attorney, 7 county treasurer, register of deeds, and register of probate. If any person shall file for incompatible 8 offices, the secretary of state shall advise the person of the provisions hereof and said person shall 9 then advise the secretary of state which of said offices he or she wishes to retain in order to seek said 10 nomination. [No person shall seek or hold the position as a member of the general court and county 11 commissioner at the same time.] 12 58:2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
