AN ACT relative to incompatibility of town offices.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Incompatibility of Offices. Amend RSA 669:7, I to read as follows:

 $\mathbf{2}$ I. No person shall at the same time hold any 2 of the following offices: selectman, treasurer, 3 moderator, trustee of trust funds, collector of taxes, auditor, cemetery trustee, and highway agent. No person shall at the same time hold any 2 of the following offices: town treasurer, moderator, 4trustee of trust funds, cemetery trustee, selectman and head of the town's police department on full- $\mathbf{5}$ 6 time duty. No person shall at the same time hold the offices of town treasurer and town clerk. No 7full-time town employee shall at the same time hold the office of selectman. No official handling 8 funds of a town shall at the same time hold the office of auditor. No selectman, moderator, town 9 clerk or inspector of elections shall at the same time serve as a supervisor of the checklist. No 10selectman, town manager, school board member except a cooperative school board member, full-time 11 town, village district, school district except a cooperative school district, or other associated agency 12employee or village district commissioner shall at the same time serve as a budget committee 13member-at-large under RSA 32. 142 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
