STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

AN ACT                   relative to fees for reinstatement of licenses, registrations, and certifications  
                                  established by the pharmacy board.

*Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:*

1           10:1 Pharmacy Board; Fees; Reinstatement. Amend RSA 318:6-a to read as follows:  
2           318:6-a Fees.

3           ***I.*** The board shall establish fees for examination of applicants, for licenses and for renewal of  
4 licenses to practice pharmacy, for registration and certification of pharmacy technicians, and for  
5 transcribing and transferring records and other services.

6           ***II.*** ***The fee for restoration of a suspended, revoked, or voluntarily surrendered***  
7 ***license, registration, or certification under this chapter shall not include the assessment of***  
8 ***charges or renewal fees for the period in which the licensee, registrant, or certificate***  
9 ***holder was not permitted to practice in this state.***

10          10:2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
