## ANALYSIS

This bill revives the commission to review and consider alcoholic beverage manufacturing processes and retail sales at manufacturing facilities, which was repealed November 1, 2014.

### In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Fifteen

AN ACT reviving the commission to review and consider alcoholic beverage manufacturing processes and retail sales at manufacturing facilities.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

6	I. There is established a commission to review and consider alcoholic beverage

10	(b) Three members of the house of representatives, appointed by the speaker of the
11	house of representatives.
12	(c) One representative of the New Hampshire Lodging and Restaurant association,
13	appointed by the association.
14	(d) One representative of a nano brewery licensee, appointed by the speaker of the house
15	of representatives.
16	(e) One representative of a liquor manufacturer licensee, appointed by the speaker of the
17	house of representatives.
18	(f) One representative of a wine manufacturer licensee, appointed by the governor.
19	(g) One representative of a rectifier licensee, appointed by the president of the senate.
20	(h) The liquor commissioner, or designee.

III. Legislative members of the commission shall receive mileage at the legislative rate when

(i) One representative of a wholesale distributor licensee, appointed by the president of

IV. The members of the commission shall elect a chairperson from among the members. The first meeting of the commission shall be called by the senate member. The first meeting of the commission shall be held within 45 days of the effective date of this section. Seven members of the commission shall constitute a quorum.
