Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1	93:1 Insurance Claims Adjusters; Definition Added. Amend the section heading, paragraph I
2	and the introductory paragraph of paragraph II of RSA 402-B:2 to read as follows:
3	402-B:2 [Definition] Definitions; Exemption.
4	I. "Home state" means the District of Columbia and any state or territory of the
5	United States in which an insurance claims adjuster maintains his or her principal place
6	of residence or principal place of business and is licensed to act as an insurance claims
7	adjuster. If such state does not issue an insurance claims adjuster license for the line of
8	business sought, the insurance claims adjuster may designate as his or her "home state"
9	any state in which the insurance claims adjuster qualifies pursuant to the provisions of
10	RSA 402-B.
11	II. In this chapter, "insurance claims adjuster" means a person who investigates, negotiates,
12	or settles property, casualty, or workers' compensation claims whether employed by or contracted by
13	or with an insurer, a claims adjusting company, or a third party administrator.
14	[II.] III. The provisions of this chapter shall not apply to the following:
15	93:2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
