AN ACT relative to the definition of deadly force.

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Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

- 1 Justification; Definition of Deadly Force. Amend RSA 627:9, II to read as follows:
- II. "Deadly force" means any assault or confinement which the actor commits [with the purpose of causing or which he knows to create a substantial risk of causing death or serious bodily injury. Purposely firing a firearm capable of causing serious bodily injury or death in the direction of another person or at a vehicle in which another is believed to be constitutes deadly force] which results in death or permanent loss or impairment of any part of the body.
 - 2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.
