# ANALYSIS

This bill requires a school board vote to approve the reassignment of a pupil to another school.

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#### STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

AN ACT relative to a school board vote on the reassignment of a pupil.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 125:1 School Attendance; Change of School or Assignment. Amend RSA 193:3, III to read as  $\mathbf{2}$ follows: 3 III.(a) Each school board shall establish a change of school assignment policy, based on the best interest of the pupil, authorizing the superintendent to re-assign a pupil and requiring a 4  $\mathbf{5}$ vote of the school board to reassign a pupil from the public school to which he or she is currently 6 assigned to another public school, or to approve a request from another superintendent to accept a 7transfer of a pupil from a school district that is not part of the school administrative unit, provided 8 that the following conditions are met: 9 (1) The pupil's parent or legal guardian petitions the superintendent for a change of 10school assignment or consents to the superintendent's recommendation for such a change; and 11 (2) The superintendent determines that such a change would be in the pupil's best 12interest; and 13(3) The school board of each school district involved in the reassignment of 14the pupil votes to approve the reassignment; and 15(4) The total reassignments or transfers in any one school year shall not exceed one 16percent of the average daily membership in residence of a school district, or 5 percent of the average 17daily membership in residence of any single school, whichever is greater, unless the school board 18votes to exceed this limit. 19(b) In accordance with the number of pupils authorized in this paragraph, a 20superintendent may [approve] recommend reassignment of a pupil: 21(1) To another school within the same school district; or 22(2) To another school district within the same school administrative unit; or 23(3) To a school district in another school administrative unit, subject to the pupil 24meeting the admission requirements of such school, and subject to the agreement of the 25superintendent of the receiving school administrative unit and the approval of the school boards 26of each school district. 27(c) [Where such reassignment exceeds the percentage limitations established in this paragraph, the approval of the school board shall be required. 2829(d) A pupil reassigned under this paragraph shall be counted in the average daily 30 membership in residence of the pupil's resident school district. The pupil's resident district shall

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1 forward any tuition payment due to the district to which the pupil was reassigned.

2 [(c)] (d) The superintendents involved in the reassignment of a pupil shall jointly 3 establish a tuition rate for each such pupil. [Notwithstanding any law to the contrary,] Some or all of 4 the tuition may be waived by the superintendent of the receiving district for the good cause shown or 5 pursuant to school board policy of the receiving district. The cost of transportation shall be the 6 responsibility of the parent or legal guardian.

7 [(f)] (e) The superintendent of the pupil's resident school administrative unit shall notify
8 the department of education within 30 days of any reassignment of pupils under this paragraph.

9 [(g)] (f) Nothing in this paragraph shall alter or impair the right of a child with a 10 disability, as defined in RSA 186-C:2, to be accorded a due process review pursuant to rules adopted 11 under RSA 186-C:16.

12 [(h)] (g) Notwithstanding RSA 21-N:11, III, for the purposes of this paragraph, the 13 decision of the superintendent shall be final.
