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STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Fifteen

AN ACT establishing a commission to study the use of police personnel files as they relate to the Laurie List.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1	150:1 New Section; Commission on Use of Police Personnel Files. Amend RSA 105 by inserting
2	after section 13-b the following new section:
3	105:13-c Commission on Use of Police Personnel Files.
4	I. There is established a commission to study the use of police personnel files as they relate
5	to the Laurie List.
6	II.(a) The members of the commission shall be as follows:
7	(1) One member of the senate, appointed by the president of the senate.
8	(2) Three members of the house of representatives, appointed by the speaker of the
9	house of representatives.
10	(3) The attorney general, or designee.
11	(4) One county attorney, appointed by the New Hampshire Association of Counties.
12	(5) One sheriff, appointed by the New Hampshire Sheriff's Association.
13	(6) One public defender, appointed by the New Hampshire Public Defender.
14	(7) One criminal defense lawyer, appointed by the New Hampshire Association of
15	Criminal Defense Lawyers.
16	(8) One chief of police appointed by the New Hampshire Association of Chiefs of
17	Police.
18	(9) The commissioner of the department of safety, or designee.
19	(10) One police officer, appointed by the New Hampshire Police Association
20	(11) One superior court judge, appointed by the chief justice of the superior court.
21	(12) One circuit court judge, appointed by the chief justice of the circuit court.
22	(13) The director of the American Civil Liberties Union of New Hampshire, or
23	designee.
24	(14) A victim/witness advocate, appointed by the director of the office of
25	victim/witness assistance.
26	(b) Legislative members of the commission shall receive mileage at the legislative rate
27	when attending to the duties of the commission.

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III. The commission shall study the use of police personnel files as they relate to the Laurie	
List. The commission's study shall include, but not be limited to, what the appropriate procedure	
and criteria should be for being placed on or removed from the Laurie List. The commission shall	
study any other issue that the commission deems relevant to its objective. The commission may	
solicit the advice or testimony of any organization or individual with information or expertise	
relevant to its study.	
IV. The members of the commission shall elect a chairperson from among the members. The	
first meeting of the commission shall be called by the first-named senate member. The first meeting	
of the commission shall be held within 45 days of the effective date of this section. Eight members of	
the commission shall constitute a quorum.	
V. The commission shall report its findings and any recommendations for proposed	
legislation to the president of the senate, the speaker of the house of representatives, the senate	
clerk, the house clerk, the governor, and the state library on or before November 1, 2015 .	
150:2 Repeal. RSA 105:13-c, relative to the commission on use of police personnel files, is	
repealed.	
150:3 Effective Date.	
I. Section 2 of this act shall take effect November 1, 2015.	
II. The remainder of this act shall take effect upon its passage.
