SENATE BILL **134-FN**

AN ACT relative to the escheat of United States savings bonds.

SPONSORS: Sen. Feltes, Dist 15

COMMITTEE: Ways and Means

ANALYSIS

This bill specifies the conditions under which unclaimed United States savings bonds escheat to the state of New Hampshire.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

In the Year of Our Lord Two Thousand Fifteen

AN ACT relative to the escheat of United States savings bonds.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 152:1 New Section; Unclaimed United States Savings Bonds. Amend RSA 471-C by inserting $\mathbf{2}$ after section 43 the following new section:

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471-C:44 Unclaimed United States Savings Bonds

I. In this section, "United States savings bond" means property, tangible or intangible, in the 4 form of a savings bond issued by the United States treasury whether in paper form, electronic, or $\mathbf{5}$ paperless form, along with all proceeds thereof. 6

7II. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, United States savings bonds held or owing in 8 this state by any person, or issued or owed in the course of a holder's business, or by a state or other 9 government, governmental subdivision, agency, or instrumentality, and all proceeds thereof, shall be 10 presumed abandoned and unclaimed in this state if:

11 (a) The last known address of the owner of the United States savings bond is in 12New Hampshire; and

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(b) The United States savings bond has remained unclaimed and unredeemed for 5 years after final maturity.

15United States savings bonds which are presumed abandoned and unclaimed under III. 16paragraph II, including bonds in the possession of the administrator, and those lost, stolen, or destroyed 17bonds registered to persons with last known addresses in the state, shall escheat to the state of New 18Hampshire one year after such bonds are presumed abandoned, and all property rights and legal title to 19and ownership of the United States savings bonds or proceeds from the bonds, including all rights, 20powers, and privileges of survivorship of any owner, co-owner, or beneficiary, shall vest solely in the state 21of New Hampshire according to the procedure set forth in paragraphs IV and IX.

22IV. Within 180 days after the one year prescribed in paragraph III, if no claim has been filed 23with the administrator for such United States savings bonds, the administrator may commence a 24civil action in the Merrimack County superior court, or in any other court of competent jurisdiction, 25for a determination that such United States savings bonds shall escheat to the state of New Hampshire. The administrator may postpone the bringing of such action until sufficient 2627United States savings bonds have accumulated in the administrator's custody to justify the expense 28of such proceedings.

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- V. The administrator shall make service by publication of the civil action in accordance with 1 $\mathbf{2}$ RSA 471-C:20.
- 3 VI. Before service by publication as required by paragraph V of this section can be made, the 4 administrator shall file with the court an affidavit or a declaration stating all of the following facts $\mathbf{5}$ that apply:

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(a) The residences of all named persons sought to be served, if known, and the names of $\overline{7}$ all persons whose residences are unknown after reasonable effort to ascertain them and the specific 8 efforts made to ascertain their residences.

9 (b) The affiant or declarant has made a reasonable but unsuccessful effort to ascertain 10the names and residences of any person or persons sought to be served as unknown parties and the 11 specific efforts made to ascertain the names and residences.

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(c) The affiant or declarant seeking service by publication is unable to obtain service of summons on the person or persons in this state.

14(d) The affiant or declarant seeking service by publication sent notice by certified mail to 15the last known address in New Hampshire of the person or persons of their ability to make a claim.

16VII. If no person files a claim with the administrator or appears at the court hearing to 17substantiate a claim or where the court determines that a claimant is not entitled to the property 18 claimed by such claimant, then the court, if satisfied by evidence that the administrator has 19substantially complied with the laws of the state of New Hampshire, shall enter a judgment that the 20subject United States savings bonds, registered to persons with last known addresses in the state, 21have escheated to the state of New Hampshire, and all property rights and legal title to and 22ownership of such United States savings bonds or proceeds from such bonds, including all rights, 23powers, and privileges of survivorship of any owner, co-owner or beneficiary, shall vest in the state of 24New Hampshire.

25VIII. The administrator shall redeem such United States savings bonds escheated to the state 26of New Hampshire and when the proceeds which have escheated have been recovered by the 27administrator, it shall first pay all costs incident to the collection and recovery of such proceeds from 28the redemption of the United States savings bonds and shall thereafter promptly deposit the remaining 29balance of such proceeds to the state general fund, to be distributed in accordance with law.

30 IX. Any person making a claim for the United States savings bonds which have escheated to the state of New Hampshire under this section, or for the proceeds from such bonds which have 3132escheated to the state of New Hampshire, may file a claim with the administrator. Upon providing 33 sufficient proof of the validity of such person's claim, the administrator may pay such claim less any 34expenses and costs, not to exceed 10 percent of the bond's proceeds, which shall have been incurred by the state in securing full title and ownership of such property by escheat. If payment has been 3536 made to any claimant, no action thereafter shall be maintained by any other claimant against the
