# ANALYSIS

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 103:1 Shellfish Inspection Program; Records. Amend RSA 143:22 to read as follows:

 $\mathbf{2}$ 143:22 Certificate Required; Labeling; Records. No person[, firm, or corporation] or facility shall [operate an establishment for the processing] process or [packing of] pack shellfish either 3 shucked or in the shell until [he has been granted] a certificate has been granted by the 4  $\mathbf{5}$ department of health and human services. A certificate shall be issued to any [establishment] facility which has complied with the rules of the commissioner of the department of health and 6 7human services relative thereto. All certificates issued under this section shall expire on [December] 8 *March* 31 next following the date of issuance. All containers of shellfish shall bear identification in 9 accordance with rules adopted by the commissioner of the department of health and human services. 10An accurate daily record shall be kept by all [establishments] certified *facilities* listing the [names] 11 name and [addresses] location of [all persons from whom lots of shellfish are received, the location 12of the source of each lot, and the names and addresses of all persons to whom lots are shipped or 13sold] the dealer, the date and time of the activity that the record reflects, the signature or initials of the person performing the operation, and the identity of the product and the 1415production code. [Such] Processing and other information shall be entered on records at 16the time that it is observed. All records shall be [kept on file for 60 days and] retained at the facility for at least one year after the date the records were prepared in the case of 17refrigerated products and for at least 2 years after the date the records were prepared in 1819the case of frozen products. Records that relate to the general adequacy of equipment or 20processes being used by a processor, including the results of scientific studies and evaluations shall be retained at the facility for at least 2 years after their applicability to 2122the product being produced at the facility. All records shall be open to inspection [at any time 23during business hours] by agents of the department *at any time*. 24103:2 Effective Date. This act shall take effect January 1, 2016.
