AN ACT relative to the New Hampshire birth conditions program and relative to the administration of certain prescription medication for treatment of a communicable disease.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 42:1 Birth Conditions Program; Definitions. Amend RSA 141-J:2, I to read as follows:

I. "Birth condition" means one or more of the birth conditions [listed in the "Guidelines for

3 Conducting Birth Defects Surveillance" established] recommended by the National Birth Defects

4 Prevention Network and/or the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention.

42:2 New Section; Public Health; Communicable Disease; Administration of Certain
Prescription Medication for Treatment or Prevention of a Communicable Disease. Amend RSA 141C by inserting after section 15 the following new section:

- 8 141-C:15-a Administration of Certain Prescription Medication for Treatment or Prevention of a
 9 Communicable Disease.
- 10 I. Notwithstanding the provisions of RSA 326-B:2, I-a, and RSA 329:1-c, a health care 11 professional authorized to prescribe prescription medication for the treatment or prevention of a 12communicable disease may prescribe, dispense, or distribute directly or by standing order, an 13antimicrobial medication to a patient he or she did not evaluate and with whom there is no 14 established health care provider-patient relationship to empirically treat for, or provide prophylaxis 15to prevent, a communicable disease that poses a threat to public health. Any such prescription shall 16be regarded as being issued for a legitimate medical purpose and in accordance with established 17clinical practice guidelines, when available.

II. Communicable diseases that pose a threat to public health for the purposes of paragraphI shall be limited to the following:

20 (a) Bordetella pertussis, Chlamydia trachomatis, Neisseria gonorrhea, and Neisseria 21 meningitis; or

(b) Diseases that constitute an immediate threat to public health and for which the commissioner, or designee, issues clinical guidance that requests providers to consider prescribing, dispensing, or distributing antimicrobial agents under paragraph I in order to control a disease outbreak.

III. No health care professional who, acting in good faith and with reasonable care, prescribes, dispenses, or distributes an antimicrobial medication for the treatment or prevention of a communicable disease as described in paragraph I, shall be subject to any criminal or civil liability, or any professional disciplinary action, for any action authorized by this section or any
