This bill establishes a procedure for voluntarily registering docks with the department of environmental services.

Be it Enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court convened:

1 1 Excavating and Dredging Permit; Registration for Seasonal Docks. Amend RSA 482-A:3, I(d)- $\mathbf{2}$ (e) to read as follows:

(d) If an applicant chooses to register a seasonal dock, at the time the applicant 4 registers with the department, he or she shall also submit a nonrefundable fee of \$200.

(e) At the time the applicant files the application with the department, the applicant shall provide written notice of the proposed project to:

(1) All abutters, as defined in the rules of the department, unless exempted in such 8 rules, which shall be provided by certified mail or other delivery method that provides proof of 9 The applicant shall retain such receipts and provide copies to the department upon receipt. 10 request. The department shall have no obligation to verify the identity of abutters or their receipt of notice. Any abutter who has actual notice of the filing of an application shall have no cause to 11 12challenge the application based on failure to receive written notice. Nothing in this subparagraph 13shall prevent the department from taking appropriate action in the event an applicant fails to 14provide the required notice or provides false information.

15(2) The local river management advisory committee if the project is within a river 16corridor as defined in RSA 483:4, XVIII, or a river segment designated in RSA 483:15. Such notice 17shall be sent by certified mail or other delivery method that provides proof of receipt. The applicant 18shall retain such receipts and provide copies to the department upon request. The local river 19management advisory committee shall, under RSA 483:8-a, III(a)-(b), advise the commissioner and 20consider and comment on the permit application.

21((e)) (f) Beginning October 1, 2007, the department shall submit an annual report to the 22house and senate finance committees, the house resources, recreation and development committee, 23and the senate energy and natural resources committee relative to administration of the wetlands 24fees permit process established by this section.

252 Excavating and Dredging Permit; Certain Exemptions. Amend RSA 482-A:3, IV-a to read as follows: 26

27IV-a.(a) [Temporary] Seasonal docks [installed on any lake or pond] shall be exempt from 28the permitting requirements of this section, provided that a notification is sent to the structure 29has a valid registration filed with the department by the owner of property in accordance 30 with RSA 482-A:11, XI that includes the name and address of the property owner, a copy of the 31deed for the property on which the dock is to be installed, the municipality, the waterbody,

1 [and] tax map and lot number on which the proposed dock will be located, and plans of the $\mathbf{2}$ waterfront and structure to be installed showing that the requirements of this paragraph 3 will be met. To qualify for an 4 exemption under this paragraph, a [temporary] seasonal dock shall be: $\mathbf{5}$ [(a)] (1) The only docking structure on the frontage; 6 $\overline{7}$ (b) (2) Constructed to be removed during the non-boating season; [(e)] (3) Removed from the lake bed for a minimum of 5 months of each year; 8 9 (d) (4) Configured to be narrow, rectangular, and erected perpendicular to the 10 shoreline of a lake or pond or parallel to the bank of a river; 11 (e) (5) No more than 6 feet wide and no more than 40 feet long if the water body is 121,000 acres or larger, or no more than 30 feet long if the water body is a river or less than 1,000 13acres *in size*: 14[(f)] (6) Located on a parcel of land that has 75 feet or more of shoreline frontage; 15(g) (7) Located at least 20 feet from an abutting property line or the imaginary 16extension of the property line over the water; Installed in a manner which requires no modification, regrading, or 17[(h)] **(8)** 18recontouring of the shoreline, such as installation of a concrete pad for construction of a hinged 19dock; 20(i) (9) Installed in a manner which complies with RSA 483-B; and 21[(+)] (10) Installed in a location that is not in, or adjacent to, an area that has been 22designated as a prime wetland in accordance with RSA 482-A:15. 23(b) Registrations for the installation of seasonal docks and for the repair or 24replacement of legally existing docking structures shall be valid for a period of 2 years 25from the date of issue or until ownership of the property changes, whichever occurs first. 26(c) Within 10 business days of receipt of a registration filing, the department 27shall issue a written notice to the property owner stating that the registration has either 28been accepted and issued a registration number, or rejected. If the department does not 29respond within the 10-day period, the property owner or agent may submit to the department a written request for a response. If the department fails to respond to the 30 written request within an additional 5 days the property owner or agent shall be deemed 3132to have submitted a complete and qualifying registration and may proceed with the 33installation of the seasonal dock or repair or replacement of the legally existing docking structures as presented in the registration filing. The authorization provided by this 3435subparagraph shall not relieve the applicant of complying with all requirements applicable to the project, including but not limited to requirements established in or 36 37under this chapter and RSA 485-A relative to water quality.

3 New Paragraph; Administrative Provisions. Amend RSA 482-A:11 by inserting after
4 paragraph X the following new paragraph:

5 XI. The commissioner shall adopt rules pursuant to RSA 541-A, establishing registration 6 forms, the registration renewal process, and the display of registration number and the registration 7 process for the installation of seasonal docking structures and the repair or replacement of legally 8 existing docking structures pursuant to RSA 482-A:3, IV-a.

9 4 Posting of Permits; Display of Registration Numbers. Amend RSA 482-A:12 to read as 10 follows:

11 482-A:12 Posting of Permits, *Display of Registration Numbers*, and Reports of Violations. 12Project approval by the department shall be in the form of a permit, a copy of which the applicant 13shall post in a secured manner in a prominent place at the site of the approved project. The 14department shall mail a copy of such permit to the local governing body of the municipality where the project is located. Any registration number issued by the department pursuant to RSA 1516482-A:3, IV-a(c) shall be prominently displayed on the lakeward face of the docking 17structures. Any person proceeding without a posted permit shall be in violation of this chapter. 18All state, county, and local law enforcement officers are directed to be watchful for violations of the 19provisions of this chapter and to report all suspected violations to the department. 205 Effective Date. This act shall take effect 60 days after its passage.

METHODOLOGY:

The Department of Environmental Services states this bill would convert the existing seasonal dock notification process to a voluntary registration process and expand that process to include docks on rivers. The registrations would be valid for two years and include a \$200 fee. The Department assumes the bill would have no effect on the number of individuals seeking a seasonal dock on a lake or a pond in any given year. The Department indicates existing computer systems and staff could implement these changes with a minimal increase in expenditures. The Department has received an average of 126 annual seasonal dock notifications in the previous 4 years. The Department assumes there would be an equal number of dock registrations on rivers, for a total of 252 registrations annually. The registration process would generate additional annual revenue to the wetlands and shorelands review fund of $$50,400 (252 \times $200)$. The funds would be used for the review of registrations, maintenance of registration records and to provide public information on structures located in public waters.
