GENE CHANDLER, State Representative, Carroll County,

District #01 and Chairman: Okay. We will open the meeting

<u>CHAIRMAN CHANDLER</u>: New Business. Cannon Mountain Advisory Committee, item number 17-015, Department of Resources and Economic Development and any questions of the Committee? No questions.

GARY DANIELS, State Senator, Senate District #11: Second.

CHRISTOPHER MARINO, Department of Resources and Economic Development: Sure. My name is Chris Marino. I work at the Department of Resources and Economic

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Development. That usually occurs or that occurs in this case because there's actually going to be a payoff of a significant amount of bonding that had been going, reaches the end of its 20-year period. And with that payoff, that significantly changes the ratio between Debt Service.

REP. BYRON: Okay. Thank you.
