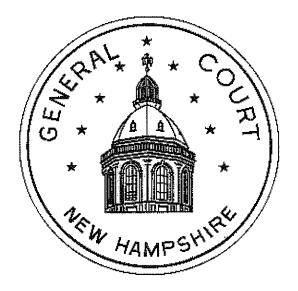

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TITLE I THE STATE AND ITS GOVERNMENT

CHAPTER 6-B INVESTMENT AND DEBT MANAGEMENT

Section 6-B:2

6-B:2 Duties of Office. – The office of investment and debt management shall, subject to any restrictions in RSA 6 and RSA 6-A, assist the treasurer in performing functions and duties as follows:

I. Analyze and manage short-term and long-term cash flow requirements.

II. Maximize the returns on state investments, considering cash flow and liquidity requirements.

III. Coordinate and monitor cash needs for investment and debt activity.

IV. Develop a long-term debt plan, including criteria for the issuance of debt and an evaluation of how much total debt is justified.

V. Evaluate revenue projections for each proposed revenue bond issue and report findings to the governor and the *CAPITAL BUDGET OVERVIEW COMMITTEE*.

VI. Advise the general court on all investment and debt matters, including, but not limited to, new bond issues, the status of state debt, and the status of state investments.

VII. Report quarterly or more often if required to the governor and council, the commissioner of administrative services and the joint legislative fiscal committee the total amount of funds in the treasury, the amount belonging to each separate fund, a summary of the funds on deposit and the investments held, and the interest income earned thereon, and any information pertaining to the duties of his office he may think proper or the governor or legislature may require.

VIII. Perform all other functions of the state treasury relative to state investment and debt management, including, but not limited to, the making of debt service payments, the sale of bonds, and the preparation of policies for the investment of state funds for yearly review and adoption by the state treasurer.

CHAPTER 9 BUDGET AND APPROPRIATIONS; REVOLVING FUNDS

Regulation of Certain Payments and Expenditures

Section 9:26-a

9:26-a Prohibited Changes. – No change shall be made in the plan, location, or design of a project in the capital budget after the project has been approved and funds appropriated, unless the change is ratified by the *CAPITAL BUDGET OVERVIEW COMMITTEE*.

CHAPTER 12-A DEPARTMENT OF RESOURCES AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

State Ski Operations

Section 12-A:29-b

12-A:29-b Cannon Mountain Advisory Commission. -

I. There is established an advisory commission which shall recommend capital improvements to the ski area and related state park facilities at Cannon Mountain.

II. The members of the commission shall be as follows:

(a) Three members appointed by the governor and council, each of whom shall have demonstrated a knowledge and capability in the field of ski area operations.

(b) Three members appointed by the president of the senate; one may be a member of the private sector and at least 2 shall be senators, one of whom shall be the senator representing the district in which Cannon Mountain is located.

(c) Three members appointed by the speaker of the house of representatives; one shall be a representative from a district within the White Mountain region, one shall be a member of the house resources, recreation and development committee, and one may be a member of the private sector.

(d) The state treasurer, who shall serve as an ex officio member.

III. The commission shall elect a chairperson from its membership, and any other officers it deems necessary. The terms of the elected members of the commission shall be coterminous with their terms in office; the terms of all other appointed members shall be 3 years. In the event of a vacancy, a new member shall be appointed for the unexpired term in the same manner as the original appointment.

IV. Members of the commission shall serve without compensation. Members shall receive mileage at the legislative rate when attending to the duties of the commission.

V. The commission shall make recommendations for capital improvements for the ski area and related state park facilities at Cannon Mountain to the commissioner of resources and economic development. The commission shall review the servicing of debt obligations relating to the Cannon Mountain capital improvement fund prior to making any such recommendations. Recommendations approved by the commissioner shall be submitted by the commissioner to the **CAPITAL BUDGET OVERVIEW COMMITTEE**. Recommendations approved by the commissioner shall be submitted to the governor and council for final approval. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, recommendations may be implemented upon final approval, pursuant to solicited requests for proposals. Funding for capital improvements shall be from the Cannon Mountain capital improvement fund established by RSA 12-A:29-c.

CHAPTER 12-G PEASE DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY

Division of Ports and Harbors

Section 12-G:46

12-G:46 Harbor Dredging and Pier Maintenance Fund Established. -

I. There is hereby established a harbor dredging and pier maintenance fund to be used by the authority acting through the division to meet its obligation to initiate and implement dredging projects to maintain channels and harbors, and to initiate projects to maintain state-owned commercial piers in safe and efficient condition.

II. The fund shall be nonlapsing and continually appropriated for the purposes of initiating and implementing harbor dredging projects and maintaining state-owned commercial piers. The authority shall, in each biennium, request annual appropriations to the fund in an amount sufficient to provide for the funding of the authority's periodic harbor dredging and pier maintenance efforts. The state treasurer shall invest the moneys deposited in the fund as provided by law. Interest earned on moneys deposited in the fund shall be deposited into the fund.

III. The authority shall not encumber, obligate, or expend any funds from the harbor dredging and pier maintenance fund without the prior approval of the *CAPITAL BUDGET OVERVIEW COMMITTEE*.

CHAPTER 14 LEGISLATIVE OFFICERS AND PROCEEDINGS

Legislative Budget Assistant

Section 14:31-b

14:31-b Budget Division. -

I. The budget division shall:

(a) Provide technical staff assistance in the areas of finance, accounting and budgeting to the appropriations, finance, ways and means, and *CAPITAL BUDGET OVERVIEW COMMITTEE*s and such other committees, including joint committees, of the general court as the fiscal committee may from time to time designate, upon the request of any of such committees or the fiscal committee.

(b) Prepare fiscal notes and amendments to fiscal notes as required by RSA 14:44-47.

(c) Prepare fiscal impact statements as defined in RSA 541-A:1, VII.

(d) Conduct orientation programs and prepare and distribute summary materials regarding the budget and budget process to the full membership of the house and senate.

II. The legislative budget assistant shall attend all hearings on state budgets as provided for in RSA 9:7.

17-J:1 Committee Established. – A joint legislative *CAPITAL BUDGET OVERVIEW COMMITTEE* is hereby established.

CHAPTER 17-J CAPITAL BUDGET OVERVIEW COMMITTEE

Section 17-J:2

17-J:2 Membership and Organization. -

I. The members of the committee shall be:

(a) Chairperson of the house public works and highways committee;

(b) Two other members of the house public works and highways committee, appointed by the speaker of the house;

(c) Three members of the house finance committee, appointed by the speaker of the house;

(d) Chairperson of the senate capital budget committee; and

(e) Three other senators appointed by the president of the senate.

I-a. Of the 6 house members on the committee, not more than 5 shall be members of the same party, and of the 4 senate members on the committee, not more than 3 shall be members of the same party.

II. In voting, the members from each house shall vote as a block, casting a single vote. The committee shall elect its own officers.

17-J:3 Terms. – All members shall be appointed to the committee for a term ending when their elected legislative term ends.

CHAPTER 17-J CAPITAL BUDGET OVERVIEW COMMITTEE

Section 17-J:4

17-J:4 Duties. – The *CAPITAL BUDGET OVERVIEW COMMITTEE* shall review the status of capital budget projects both during and between legislative sessions. Each state agency with capital budget projects shall report to the department of administrative services, in the format the department of administrative services prescribes, for the quarters ending September 30, December 31, March 31, and June 30. The department of administrative services shall combine these reports and present the summarized report to the *CAPITAL BUDGET OVERVIEW COMMITTEE* for review quarterly on the first of November, February, May, and August. The department of administrative services, division of public works design and construction shall, within 90 days of the approval of funding for any capital budget project, submit a timeline or schedule for such project to the *CAPITAL BUDGET OVERVIEW COMMITTEE* for review.

CHAPTER 21-I DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES

General Provisions

Section 21-I:12

21-I:12 Internal Organization of the Divisions of Procurement and Support Services, Public Works Design and Construction, and Plant and Property. –

I. The division of procurement and support services shall include the following internal organizational units and functions:

(a) A bureau of purchase and property under the supervision of a classified administrator of purchase and property who shall be responsible for the following functions, in accordance with applicable laws:

(1) Procurement of supplies, commodities, and services except as otherwise assigned to other bureaus or divisions of the department.

(2) Purchasing only heating oil that contains at least 5 percent biodiesel, as defined in RSA 362-A:1-a, I-b, except if such product is unavailable or is more costly than a 100 percent petroleum product, in which case such purchase shall be made at the discretion of the director of procurement and support services. The director, when using such discretion, shall consider at a minimum any savings related to equipment maintenance and longevity that may result from biodiesel use.

(3) Purchasing biodiesel fuel blends for the department of transportation in accordance with RSA 228:24-a, II.

(4) Maintaining and operating such central storage facilities as may be practical.

(5) Charging property and equipment to the using departments, as he or she shall deem advisable, and expressly specifying the responsibilities for maintenance of the same.

(6) Transferring unused supplies and equipment from one department or agency to another where needed and determining the value thereof; where such unused supplies and equipment cannot be so transferred, providing for disposal to the public by competitive bid whenever the estimated value of any unit or total of units is \$100 or more, otherwise in such manner as appears to be in the best interest of the state.

(7) There shall be within the bureau of purchase and property a surplus distribution section, which shall continue to operate for such period of time as surpluses or donated commodities of any kind are made available for distribution to the state by any department, division, or agency of the United States government or by any other source. The surplus distribution section shall be under the supervision of a classified supervisor of surplus distribution, who shall be responsible for the following functions, in accordance with applicable laws:

(A) Requesting, transporting, receiving, warehousing, allocating, enforcing compliance, and delivering, where deemed expedient, any surpluses or commodities made available to the state by the federal government or by any other source.

(B) Assuring that all contracts, agreements, leases, or other documents entered into by

the commissioner in order to operate the program of distribution of federal commodities and surpluses comply with the regulations and directives of the federal government.

(C) In his or her discretion, receiving, allocating, and distributing food supplies and other school food services supplies in cooperation with the New Hampshire School Food Service Association Co-operative, Inc., and such activities shall in no way constitute a restriction of trade.

(D) In his or her discretion, participating and cooperating in informational projects relating to distributions made by the agency.

(b) The department's functions relating to merchant payment cards, fleet management, reporting on state real property under RSA 4:39-e and RSA 21-I:11, I(a)(5), and facilitation of the disposition of state-owned real property, managed by such personnel, as may be assigned by the commissioner.

(c) A bureau of graphic services under the supervision of a classified administrator of graphic services who shall be responsible for the following functions:

(1) Supervising all state printing and its procurement.

(2) Ensuring that all legislative printing within the capability of the bureau of graphic services shall, at all times, have priority over other work of the bureau.

(3) Providing the capability to levy cost charges on the use of each state photocopier.

(4) Using the prison print shop to the extent it can efficiently do so to function as a vocational rehabilitation facility under the direct supervision of prison authority, provided the prison print shop shall be entitled to bid on any appropriate state printing job.

(5) Managing a service operation which shall provide graphic services to all state agencies.

(d) With reference to the bureau of graphic services and the rulemaking authority of the commissioner in this area, "graphic services" shall mean any method of producing written or pictorial representations and shall include, but not be limited to, all forms of photography, photocopy, duplicating, and printing.

(e) The following exceptions to the authority of the administrator of graphic services shall apply:

(1) He or she shall exercise no management or other authority over the forensic science laboratory established in RSA 106-B:2-a.

(2) He or she shall exercise no management or other authority over the printing, duplication, photocopying, photographic, or other graphic services equipment or personnel of the university system of New Hampshire, the department of transportation, the department of employment security, and the general court.

II. The division of plant and property shall include the following internal organizational units and functions:

(a) A bureau of planning and management under the supervision of a classified administrator of planning and management who shall be responsible for the following functions, in accordance with applicable laws:

(1) Recommending assignment of office and office-related space, including rented space, or space under consideration for rental, to the director, who shall report such recommendations to the commissioner.

(2) Preparing and maintaining an inventory of all physical space in real property rented or leased for use by the state. This inventory shall be made available to the comptroller in order to assist the comptroller to comply with accounting principles.

(3) Planning for any additional office space needs of the state in consultation with the

division of public works design and construction.

(4) Planning for any major renovation to state office buildings in consultation with the division of public works design and construction.

(5) Centrally managing all space rented by, or all proposed rentals of space by, state agencies, and providing central administration and management of the processes by which space is rented by state agencies, except as is otherwise provided by law. Unless otherwise allowed by law, agencies seeking to rent space shall do so only in consultation with the bureau of planning and management. The central management and administration provided by the bureau shall include assisting agencies in their selection of property, in the formulation of rental documents, in the preparation of notices, in agencies' solicitation of bids or proposals and selection of lessors, in space planning, in office layout, and in such other matters as are necessary for effective central planning and management relative to rented space but shall not include the power to enter into rental agreements on behalf of an agency.

(b) A bureau of general services under the supervision of a classified administrator of general services who shall be responsible for the following functions, in accordance with applicable laws:

(1) Providing support services, including but not limited to, mailing and messenger services to state government.

(2) Providing for the general maintenance of state-owned buildings and grounds, except as otherwise provided by law.

(c) A bureau of court facilities under the supervision of a classified administrator who shall be responsible for the following functions, in accordance with applicable laws:

(1) Providing suitable court facilities for the conduct of all court sessions held within each judicial district and county, subject to the availability of appropriated funds, in accordance with RSA 490-B.

(2) Providing for the general maintenance of state-owned court buildings and grounds, except as otherwise provided by law.

(d) The department's functions relating to energy management, managed by such personnel as may be assigned by the commissioner.

(e) The department's support of facilities of the department of health and human services managed by such personnel as may be assigned by the commissioner.

III. The division of public works design and construction shall be responsible for the following functions in accordance with applicable law:

(a) Supervising and overseeing the department's public works design and construction functions.

(b) Public works engineering, including planning and design for all public works projects as described in RSA 21-I:78 through RSA 21-I:86.

(c) Field supervision of all public works construction as described in RSA 21-I:78 through RSA 21-I:86.

(d) Supervision and coordination of all state-owned land and buildings not otherwise assigned, including, but not limited to, performing those functions specified in RSA 21-I:84, I.

(e) Except as otherwise provided by law, developing state-owned and supported land and buildings, and preparing a long range capital improvements plan, which shall be communicated to the commissioner of administrative services, or designee.

(f) Communicating with the commissioner of administrative services, or designee, the activities of the division relative to the capitol budget overview process. The commissioner of

administrative services, or designee, shall coordinate the department's activities relative to the **capital budget overview** process and shall communicate with the general court regarding that process as it relates to public works.

(g) Communicating with the commissioner of administrative services, or designee, long range capital planning relative to public works design and construction. The commissioner of administrative services, or his or her designee, shall coordinate the department's long range capital planning relative to public works design and construction to meet the needs of the state.

(h) The supervision and operation of all public works of the state not otherwise provided for or assigned by law.

CHAPTER 21-I DEPARTMENT OF ADMINISTRATIVE SERVICES

Public Works Design and Construction

Section 21-I:80

21-I:80 Major Projects. -

I. Each state project whose estimated cost is more than \$25,000 shall be built under contracts awarded to the lowest qualified bidder who meets all project specifications through competitive bidding. The following are excluded from this competitive bidding requirement:

(a) Projects executed under RSA 481 with approval of the governor and council.

(b) Projects for the department of fish and game, the adjutant general's department, and the department of resources and economic development whose estimated total cost is not more than \$250,000. Such projects may be done on a force account basis, by contracts awarded through competitive bidding, by short term rental of construction equipment, or by any combination of these methods. These departments are authorized to rent construction equipment for periods not exceeding 6 months at rates the departments deem competitive through the use of quotes or bids.

(c) In an emergency, projects may be done on a force account basis upon the recommendation of the commissioner, with the approval of the governor and council.

(d) Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the commissioner is authorized to use the design build and construction management methods of contracting for any project. The *CAPITAL BUDGET OVERVIEW COMMITTEE* shall approve preliminary plans prior to construction, reconstruction, alteration, or maintenance if the project is part of a capital project and:

(1) The construction management method of contracting is used; or

(2) The design build method of contracting is used and the estimated cost is more than \$500,000. If the design-build method of contracting is used and the estimated cost is \$500,000 or less, preapproval of the *CAPITAL BUDGET OVERVIEW COMMITTEE* shall not be required, but the department shall notify the committee of all such projects and shall provide quarterly

reports on project status.

II. Any state project whose estimated cost is more than \$500,000 shall be designed by a registered architect or professional engineer unless, upon recommendation of the commissioner, the governor and council shall find that it is in the best interests of the state to provide for inhouse design. He or she shall prepare plans and specifications which meet the requirements of all applicable codes and shall provide on-site observation and inspection services. Each registered architect or professional engineer shall carry professional liability insurance in an amount satisfactory to the commissioner consistent with industry standards.

III. After written application to the *CAPITAL BUDGET OVERVIEW COMMITTEE*, the requirements of paragraph II may be waived upon approval of the *CAPITAL BUDGET OVERVIEW COMMITTEE* and the governor and council.

IV. State capital budget projects shall not be awarded through cost-plus contracts.

V. Any repair project authorized in the capital budget which requires consultant services shall be put into effect within 90 days after the adoption of the capital budget.

VI. (a) Prior to any work being done by an individual contractor on any major project under this section, such contractor, including all subcontractors and independent contractors, excluding deliveries to and removals from a project administered by the department, shall provide to the commissioner of administrative services:

(1) A certificate of insurance of his or her current workers' compensation coverage in New Hampshire for the classification of work to be completed on the project;

(2) A sworn statement that this coverage shall remain in effect for the duration of his or her anticipated work on the project;

(3) A completed work certificate, provided pursuant to RSA 281-A:4-b, that shall include the total number of employees anticipated to be employed by such contractor, subcontractor, or independent contractor on the project during the contract period, delineated by the National Council on Compensation Insurance (NCCI) classification code applicable to the scope of work to be performed;

(4) A copy of the contractor's compliance with a current written safety program, if applicable, as filed with the commissioner of labor under RSA 281-A:64, II and proof of an existing joint loss management committee as required under RSA 281-A:64, III, if applicable; and

(5) The department may develop procedures to obtain the requirements in this section on an annual basis or by a prequalification procedure rather than on a project-by-project basis.

(b) If any construction contractor, subcontractor, or independent contractor who might otherwise claim an exclusion under RSA 281-A:18-a is directly performing the work on a project covered under this section, such contractor, subcontractor, or independent contractor shall comply with the provisions of this section.

(c) The commissioner of labor may assess any contractor, subcontractor, or independent contractor who falsifies information or fails to comply with this section a civil penalty of up to \$2,500 and in addition, such an employer shall be assessed a civil penalty of up to \$100 per employee per day of noncompliance. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, any person with control or responsibility over the decisions to disburse funds and salaries and who knowingly falsified information or knowingly failed to comply with this section shall be held personally liable for the payment of penalties under this section and such contractor, subcontractor, or independent contractor shall not be allowed to bid or work on state projects for up to 5 years. The state shall be entitled to recover from the violator all costs and fees directly

associated with uncovering falsified information supplied under this section.

(d) All funds collected under this paragraph shall be deposited into the general fund.

(e) The commissioner of labor shall appoint as many individuals as necessary to carry out the department's responsibilities under this paragraph.

(f) On a quarterly basis, the commissioners of administrative services and labor shall post electronically for public access and shall also circulate to all other public works construction or renovation awarding authorities of state government, including the college and university systems and the department of education office of building aid, a list of any construction contractors, subcontractors, or independent contractors found to be in violation of this section, including the amount fined and the period of time such persons or entities shall not be allowed to bid or work on state projects.

TITLE VIII PUBLIC DEFENSE AND VETERANS' AFFAIRS

CHAPTER 110-B THE MILITIA

Public Property

Section 110-B:28

110-B:28 National Guard Facilities. -

I. All armories, arsenals, camps, ranges, bases, airports, and other facilities owned, leased, licensed, or maintained by the state or by the United States for the use of the New Hampshire national guard and all activities conducted therein shall be under the general charge, control of, and regulated by the adjutant general and no political subdivision of the state shall interfere with or regulate such activities. The adjutant general may use the means necessary and required, including the arming of trained personnel, to protect, guard, secure and defend and maintain all such facilities. Use of force by any member of the New Hampshire national guard in duty status, shall be in accordance with the applicable Department of Defense, United States Army, and United States Air Force directives and instructions on rules of engagement and use of force. If mission specific rules of engagement are issued, the specific rules shall be followed, to the degree they deviate from the existing rules, for as long as military members are carrying out duties related to the mission for which the specific rules were issued.

II. Unless the same shall be furnished by the United States, the state shall provide adequate armory accommodations, bases, camps, target ranges, and other facilities and shall maintain the same for units of the army national guard and of the air national guard allotted to the state under the laws of the United States, accepted by the governor and organized under the authority of this chapter.

III. The adjutant general may designate an officer to be in direct charge of each armory, arsenal, camp, base, or other facility.

IV. (a) The adjutant general may cooperate with and enter into contracts or agreements with

the federal government, or any agency thereof, as he or she deems desirable to secure the participation of the United States government, through the allotment of federal funds, in the costs of constructing, enlarging, or altering armories, the state veterans cemetery, or other military facilities. The adjutant general may contract with the federal government to perform construction for building renovations or site improvements to existing state-owned facilities or land, subject to the approval of the *CAPITAL BUDGET OVERVIEW COMMITTEE* established in RSA 17-J. Any affected municipalities shall receive notice at least 14 days prior to the *CAPITAL BUDGET OVERVIEW COMMITTEE* meeting at which such projects are slated to be approved. Such federally contracted and completely federally funded projects shall either:

(1) Within 90 days prior to the end of the federal fiscal year, be designed and ready for bidding; or

(2) Where such project design is incomplete and not ready for bid, a contract may be entered into within 210 days prior to the end of the federal fiscal year.

(b) The adjutant general may adopt procedures relative to this section to ensure the best interest of the federal and state of New Hampshire governments and the national guard, including notice procedures that simultaneously provide project details to all interested parties.

V. Any military facilities which are the responsibility of the state shall be accepted by the adjutant general, after the approval of the governor and council in accordance with the provisions of RSA 4:29.

VI. For purposes of morale and unit cohesiveness and to assist in esprit de corps, units may have a social club composed of members located within national guard facilities. Any such club shall be subject to regulations issued by the adjutant general, shall be under the control of the assistant adjutant general for the air or army national guard, and shall be licensed and subject to inspection by the New Hampshire state liquor commission.

TITLE XV EDUCATION

CHAPTER 195-D NEW HAMPSHIRE HEALTH AND EDUCATION FACILITIES AUTHORITY

Section 195-D:5

195-D:5 General Grant of Powers. – The corporation has the following powers, together with all powers incidental thereto or necessary for the performance of those hereinafter stated:

I. To have perpetual succession as a public body corporate and agency of the state and to adopt bylaws for the regulation of its affairs and the conduct of its business;

II. To sue and be sued, plead and be impleaded;

III. To adopt an official seal and alter the same at pleasure;

IV. To maintain an office at such place or places as it may designate;

V. To determine the location and character of any project to be financed under the provisions of this chapter, and to construct, reconstruct, maintain, repair, operate, lease, as lessee or lessor, and regulate the same; to enter into contracts for any or all of such purposes; to enter into

contracts for the management and operation of a project; and to designate a participating institution as its agent to determine the location and character of a project undertaken by such participating institution under the provisions of this chapter as its agent to construct, reconstruct, maintain, repair, operate, lease, as lessee or lessor, and regulate the same; and as its agent to enter into contracts for any or all of such purposes, including contracts for the management and operation of such projects;

VI. To issue bonds, bond anticipation notes and other obligations of the corporation for any of its corporate purposes, and to fund or refund the same, all as provided in this chapter;

VII. Generally, to fix and revise from time to time and charge and collect rates, rents, fees and charges for the use of and for the services furnished or to be furnished by a project or any portion thereof; and to contract with any person, partnership, association or corporation or other body, public or private, in respect thereof and to designate a participating institution as its agent to fix, revise, charge and collect such rates, rents, fees and charges and to make such contracts;

VIII. To establish rules and regulations for the use of a project or any portion thereof and to designate a participating institution as its agent to establish rules and regulations for the use of a project undertaken by such participating institution;

IX. To employ consulting engineers, architects, attorneys, accountants, construction and financial experts, superintendents, managers, and such other employees and agents as are necessary in its judgment, and to fix their compensation;

X. To receive and accept from any public agency loans or grants for or in aid of the construction of a project or any portion thereof, and to receive and accept loans, grants, aid, or contributions from any source of either money, property, labor, or other things of value, to be held, used, and applied only for the purposes for which such loans, grants, aid, and contributions are made;

XI. To mortgage any project and the site thereof for the benefit of the holders of revenue bonds issued to finance the project;

XII. To make loans to any participating institution for the construction of a project in accordance with an agreement between the corporation and the participating institution. However, no such loan shall exceed the total cost of construction and equipment of the project as determined by the participating institution and approved by the corporation;

XIII. To acquire any federally guaranteed security with respect to the financing of a project or the refinancing of existing indebtedness and to pledge or otherwise use such federally guaranteed security in such manner as the corporation deems necessary or appropriate to secure or otherwise provide a source of repayment on any of its bonds or notes or to enter into any appropriate agreement with a participating institution whereby the corporation may make a loan to such participating institution for the purpose of acquiring and entering into commitments to acquire any federally guaranteed security with respect to financing of a project or the refinancing of existing indebtedness; provided, however, that the corporation, prior to making any such acquisition, commitment or loan with respect to financing a project, shall first determine, and thereafter shall enter into an agreement with any such participating institution to require, that the proceeds derived from the acquisition of any such federally guaranteed security will be used for the purpose of providing for a project;

XIV. To charge to and equitably apportion between participating institutions its administrative costs and expenses incurred in the exercise of the powers and duties conferred by this chapter;

XV. To accept any gifts or grants or loans of funds or property or financial or other aid in any form from the federal government or any agency or instrumentality thereof or from the state or

any agency or instrumentality thereof or from any other source, and to comply, subject to the provisions of this chapter, with the terms and conditions thereof;

XVI. To do all things necessary or convenient to carry out the purposes of this chapter; and

XVII. To provide for the refinancing of existing indebtedness or to make loans to a participating institution for the purpose of providing for the refinancing of existing indebtedness or repaying advances made or given by such participating institution with respect to the acquisition or construction of a project.

XVIII. Before the university system of New Hampshire or any of its components may participate in any of the provisions of this chapter, each project must receive the approval of the *CAPITAL BUDGET OVERVIEW COMMITTEE* of the general court and the approval of the governor.

XIX. To protect, indemnify, and hold harmless its members of the board of directors, officers and employees from any costs, damages, awards, judgments, or settlements arising from any claim, civil action, lawsuit, or other proceeding against them.

TITLE XX TRANSPORTATION

CHAPTER 228 ADMINISTRATION OF TRANSPORTATION LAWS

Section 228:4

228:4 State Transportation Projects. -

I. Each state transportation project shall be built under contracts awarded to the lowest responsible bidder through competitive bidding. The following are excluded from this competitive bidding requirement:

(a) Normal highway and bridge maintenance and improvements. This includes state aided town road and bridge projects.

(b) Projects executed under RSA 481 with approval of the governor and council.

(c) Statewide transportation improvement program projects with a cost not to exceed \$25,000,000 may be developed and constructed utilizing the design build concept based on a request for proposal. Such projects may be developed and constructed provided that selection is based on an objective standard and measurable criteria for evaluation of the proposals.

(d) Statewide transportation improvement program projects with a cost in excess of \$25,000,000 may be developed and constructed utilizing the design build concept based on a request for proposal provided that the department first demonstrates that using the design build concept for the project in question benefits the state more than using conventional contracting methods. The department shall hold a publicly noticed hearing to take comment on its proposal to use the design build concept for a particular project. Such notice shall be provided at least 14 days prior to the hearing date. The department shall allow for a 30-day public comment period following the publicly-noticed hearing before submitting its proposed use of the design build concept to the governor and executive council for formal approval. After the governor and

council approve use of the design build concept for the project, the department may solicit bids from contractors. Any contract with the selected bidder shall be submitted to the governor and council for final approval. The commissioner shall report the results of any statewide transportation improvement program project using the design build concept to the *CAPITAL* **BUDGET OVERVIEW COMMITTEE** within 90 days after the completion of the project. II. State transportation projects shall not be awarded through cost-plus contracts.

Section 228:12-a

228:12-a Use of Toll Credits. – The department may use toll credits as a match for federal highway funds on highway and road projects without prior approval of the legislative *CAPITAL* **BUDGET OVERVIEW COMMITTEE** established under RSA 17-J:1. Any use of toll credits other than as a match for federal highway funds on highway and road projects shall require prior approval of the committee.

TITLE XXIII LABOR

CHAPTER 282-A UNEMPLOYMENT COMPENSATION

Administrative Organization and Administration

Section 282-A:112

282-A:112 Duties and Powers of Commissioner. -

I. It shall be the duty of the commissioner of the department of employment security to administer this chapter. He shall have power and authority to adopt, amend, or rescind rules, to employ such persons, make such expenditures, require such reports, make such investigations, and take such other action as he deems necessary or suitable to that end. The commissioner shall determine his own organization and methods of procedure in accordance with the provisions of this chapter. Not later than the thirtieth day of June of each year, the commissioner shall submit to the governor a report covering the administration and operation of this chapter during the preceding calendar year and shall make such recommendations for amendments to this chapter as he deems proper. Such reports shall include a balance sheet of the moneys in the fund in which there shall be provided, if possible, a reserve against the liability in future years to pay benefits in excess of the then current contributions, which reserve shall be set up by the commissioner in accordance with accepted actuarial principles on the basis of statistics of employment, business activity, and other relevant factors for the longest possible period. Whenever the commissioner believes that a change in contribution or benefit rates will become necessary to protect the solvency of the fund, he shall promptly so inform the governor and the legislature and make recommendations with respect thereto.

II. For the purpose of establishing and maintaining free public employment offices, the commissioner of the department of employment security is authorized to enter into agreements with the railroad retirement board, or any other agency of the United States charged with the administration of an unemployment compensation law, with any political subdivision of this state, or with any private, non-profit organization; and, as a part of any such agreement, the commissioner may accept moneys, services, or quarters as a contribution to the employment service account.

III. [Repealed.]

IV. For the purpose of establishing and maintaining free public employment offices, the commissioner is authorized, except as provided in paragraph V, with the approval of the governor and council, to enter into purchase or lease purchase agreements.

V. Notwithstanding any provision of the law to the contrary, the consent of the *CAPITAL* **BUDGET OVERVIEW COMMITTEE**, established in RSA 17-J, shall be required for all total project agreements exceeding \$50,000 for:

(a) Acquisition of land or existing buildings;

(b) New construction;

(c) An addition to an existing facility; or

(d) An improvement or repair to a facility which exceeds routine maintenance.

VI. The commissioner shall not close any district office nor reduce services or hours of operation without the prior permission of the fiscal committee.

REQUESTED ACTION

In accordance with RSA 9:26-a the New Hampshire Liquor Commission respectfully requests a transfer of appropriation and approval from the Capital Budget Overview Committee to utilize funds appropriated for the Computer Software – Credit Card capital fund for the amount of \$664,000.

EXPLANATION

In 2013 the Legislature approved a Capital Budget request Chapter 195:1:XII-G, Computer Software – Credit Card for \$10,000,000 to procure and implement a new point-of-sale (POS) system to support the Liquor Commission retail outlets and supporting back office hardware and software for 77 retail stores.

In order to comply with Payment Card Industry (PCI) and bank requirements that apply to all merchants, the Commission must remove old, non-PCI compliant hardware and software immediately and replace it with compliant hardward and software. This replacement process was included in the original Capital Budget request noted above, but we have not finalized the procurement process, and some hardware and software elements noted below must be procured immediately.

Encryption software to enable credit card data to pass through the payment system in a secure manner to the bank is required to reduce or eliminate a data breach and ensure that consumers' credit card transactions are secure. The current credit card terminals have reached end-of-life and soon will no longer be supported by the manufacturer. In addition, the Commission has a

requirement to deploy EMV credit card terminals to all stores by October 15, 2015 in order to accommodate the new chip credit cards. Professional services will be necessary to assist the Commission in identifying and assisting in the RFP process and contract negotiations.

The above projects are critical to the Liquor Commission retail operations and overall state compliance with PCI requirements. Failure to comply could result in significant fines from the Payment Card Industry and loss of our ability to accept credit cards in our retail stores.

I look forward to addressing any of your committee's questions regarding this request.

Dear Representative Chandler,

In accordance with **RSA 12-G:46** <u>Harbor Dredging and Pier Maintenance Fund Established</u>, the Pease Development Authority Division of Ports and Harbors is requesting the Capital Budget Overview Committee approve the release of Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$80,000.00) from the Harbor Dredging and Pier Maintenance Fund for the purpose of purchasing and installing an above ground truck scale at the Market Street Marine Terminal.

The truck scale is a revenue generator for the Division and there are fees charged for the use of the truck scale. All cargo handled at the Market Street Marine Terminal is required to weighed for the following, but not limited to, reasons;

- Legal over the road weights for trucks hauling cargo from the terminal
- Inventory controls
- Cargo invoicing
- Stability and stowage calculations aboard the ship

The existing truck scale was installed in 1990 and is approaching is useful life (25 years). It is a below ground mechanical scale with all the mechanism in a concrete "pit" which is constantly wet thereby promoting corrosion. On January 28, 2015 the scale malfunctioned and upon inspection by Northeast Scale, the Division's service provider, it was determined that due to severe corrosion, the structure of the scale had broken beyond repair. This situation has serious negative impacts on cargo operations at the terminal with an immediate impact on the Division's tenant, Morton Salt Company, a provider of road de-icing salt to the New Hampshire Department of Transportation. The Division consulted with Northeast Scale Company to resolve this issue in the most expeditious manner possible since repair of the scale was not an option.

Northeast Scale advised that there was an above ground scale available for immediate shipment from a manufacturer on Missouri. Upon delivery the scale could be installed in a "temporary" manner on top of the existing scale deck. This was the best option so that the movement of salt could resume limiting the down time of salt operations to approximately ten (10) days. During winter months, especially with the snow events the State is experiencing, Morton Salt operates seven (7) days a week. At the end of the winter weather, the scale will be installed in a more permanent manner. Additionally, without the truck scale, the Division would not be able to attract other cargos to the marine terminal.

Based on the facts stated above, the Division of Ports and Harbors placed the order for the scale on January 29, 2015 which would be shipped February 4th, delivered on or before February 6th and installed and operational by February 9th.

On February 5, 2015, the Pease Development Authority Board of Directors authorized the Division of Ports and Harbors to request the Capital Budget Overview Committee release of the funds from the Harbor Dredging and Pier Maintenance. The balance of the Fund as of December 31, 2014 was \$455,000.00.

Therefore, in accordance with **RSA 12-G:46** <u>Harbor Dredging and Pier Maintenance Fund Established</u> the Pease Development Authority Division of Ports and Harbors requests that the Capital Budget Overview Committee authorize the release of Eighty Thousand Dollars (\$80,000.00) from the Harbor Dredging and Pier Maintenance Fund for the purpose of purchasing and installing an above ground truck scale in accordance with the attached documentation.

On the afternoon of January 28, 2015, I was informed that the truck scale was malfunctioning. It was reported to me that one of the trucks was stopped at a check point and weighed by the State Police Truck Enforcement Division and the truck was overweight even though the driver had the scale slip from here showing a legal over the road weight.

Upon notification, I called Northeast Scale who installed the original scale in 1967 and replaced it with the current scale in 1990 and asked them to inspect and repair it. Their service technician came the next day, Thursday January 29th. After his inspection he reported that part of the support structure failed and bent and at least two (2) of the support stands are bent beyond repair,

Attached is a copy of the Work Order with the hand written report from the technician specifically stating "DO NOT DRIVE ON THE SCALE!!!

There was a follow up conversation with Mr. Tony Lewis at NE Scale who went into detail about the options and the options were limited.

NE Scale said they were having difficulty locating parts for the scale and even if the parts were available, they are not sure they could get the scale certified because of the age of the remaining components and the overall condition of the components that may have been affected by the damage identified during the inspection by their technician. The scale is a mechanical scale with the steel structures in a concrete pit which collects water, is always wet and promotes corrosion of the mechanism.

Attached is a proposal by NE Scale to purchase an above ground scale and install it on top of the existing scale deck. This can be accomplished by blocking the existing scale deck from below in order to support the equipment. This would be a "temporary" installation which would allow operations to resume in the most expeditious manner.

At the end of the winter season when, when trucking of sale stops, the new scale mechanism will be disassembled, the existing mechanical scale will be removed and the existing concrete pit will be filled and compacted. A thick concrete pad will be poured atop the compacted fill and the new scale will be reassembled permanently on top.

The cost is within what I have investigated with other brands of above ground scales.

The scale generates revenue for the Division through usage fees charged tenants for weighing trucks and is critical for the handling of cargo at the terminal.

At the present time, the scale is critical to the operations of Morton Salt who dependent on the scale for the shipment of road deicing salt. Without the use of a functional scale, Morton is severely impacted.

Northeast Scale informed the division that by placing the order for the scale from the manufacturer today January 29th, shipment could be made on Wednesday, February 4th and installation could be completed over the week end of February 7th and 8th. Due to the urgency of this matter, the order was placed on January 29th.

The Division proposes to expend funds from the Harbor Dredging and Pier Maintenance Fund for the scale purchase and installation. The balance of the fund as of December 31, 2014 was \$455,000.00. Expenditures from the fund require approval from the Capital Budget Overview Committee.

Therefore, the Division of Ports and Harbors requests that the PDA Board of Directors, ratify and approve the purchase and installation of an above ground truck scale as proposed by Northeast Scale, attached, and authorize the Division to seek approval from the Capital Budget Overview Committee to expend not more than \$80,000.00 from the Harbor Dredging and Pier Maintenance Fund.

The Pease Development Authority Board of Directors hereby authorizes the Division Director to request that the Capital Budget Overview Committee ("CBOC") release \$80,000.00 from the Harbor Dredging and Pier Maintenance fund for the replacement of the truck scale at the Market Street Terminal.

Further, subject to the approval of funds by the CBOC, the Board authorizes the Executive Director to enter into a Contract with Northeast Scale Company, Inc. for the purchase and installation of the truck scale in the estimated amount of \$71,879.00; all in accordance with the memorandum of Geno Marconi, Division Director dated January 29, 2015 attached hereto.

In accordance with the provisions of RSA 12-G:8, VIII, the Board justifies the waiver of the RFP requirement for the purchase and installation of the truck scale based on the following:

- 1. The truck scale is necessary for the daily operations at the Market Street Terminal and it is imperative that the truck scale be replaced as soon as possible;
- 2. Northeast Scale Company installed and serviced the existing truck scale; and
- 3. Northeast Scale Company can replace the scale in a timely manner.

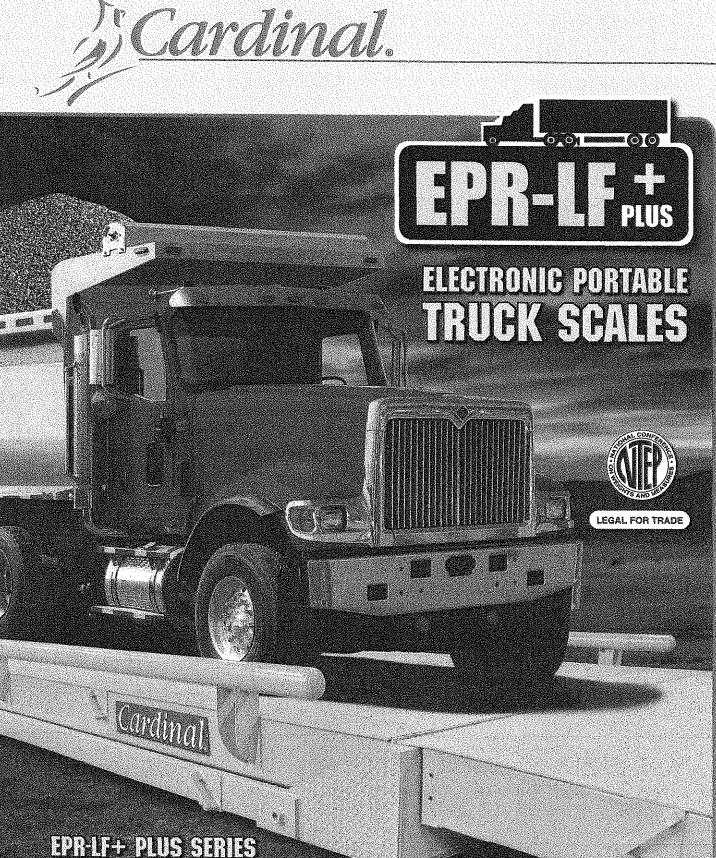

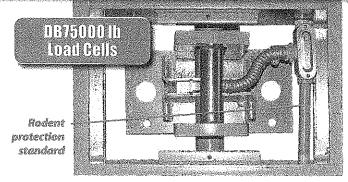

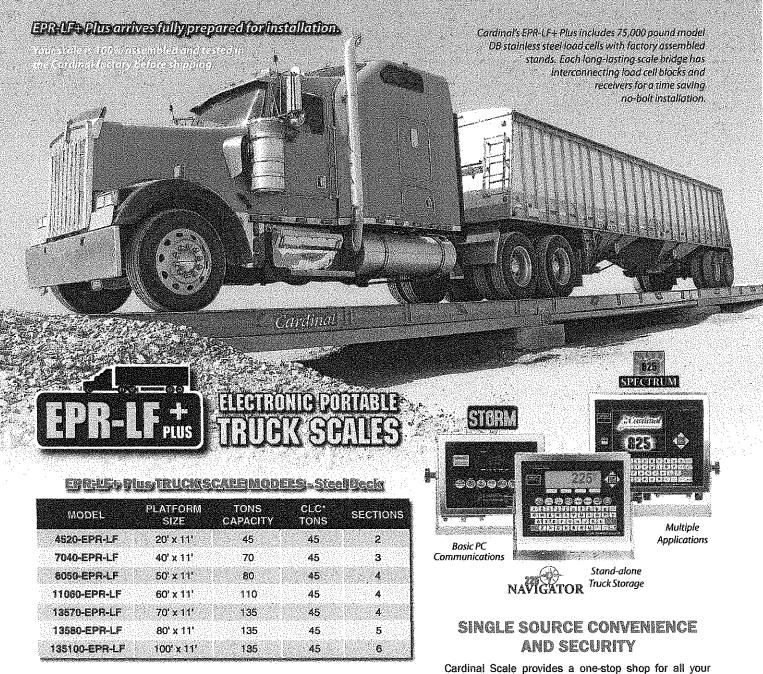

REQUESTED ACTION

In accordance with RSA 21-I:80, I (d) the Department of Administrative Services, Bureau of Public Works Design and Construction in conjunction with the Department of Safety, request approval of preliminary plans for the construction the new NH Marine Patrol Headquarters in Glendale.

EXPLANATION

The Department of Safety was appropriated \$9,379,313 under Laws of 2013, Chapter 195:2, I, D, to construct a new Marine Patrol headquarters building located on Lake Winnipesaukee in Gilford, New Hampshire. The project will include demolition of the existing Marine Patrol building, an adjacent marina building and construction of the new facility. The new headquarters building will contain new office spaces for Marine Patrol personnel (sworn/civilian), secure booking areas, dock access for water vessels, a storage facility, a mechanic's shop for repairs, ADA accessible boating, education classrooms, boat registration, administration functions and on-site parking.

Samyn-D'Elia Architects from Ashland, New Hampshire was hired to design the project. In July 2014 letters of interest and qualifications were requested from contractors. Eight firms responded and provided letters of interest and qualification packages. The firms were as follows:

The list of contractors was then reduced to the best qualified 6-firms based on experience, references, project team and bonding capacity. Those 6-firms were asked to submit Technical Proposals. Five contractors provided technical Proposals. Interviews were held in September 2014 with the following five firms:

Allied Cook Construction Portland, ME

DEW Construction Corp Williston, VT Eckman Construction Bedford, NH

Harvey Construction Bedford, NH

Meridian Construction Gilford, NH BPS Corporation (did not respond to RFP) Concord, NH

The five construction management firms were then ranked on the basis of general qualifications, clarity of the proposal, pre-construction and construction experience, their project team, and overall suitability for the assignment. (See attached scoring sheet). Based on the results of the scoring, the three highest scoring construction management firms were then requested to provide a Guaranteed Maximum Price (GMP) for the project. Our architect estimated the construction project cost to be \$8,908,065. We received bids on November 6, 2014 from the three best qualified firms with the lowest GMP of \$7,998,717 being submitted by Harvey Construction Corp. (Please see attached bid tab.) Based on the low bid we selected Harvey Construction.

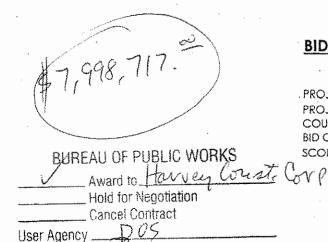
In accordance with RSA 21-I; 80 I (d) we are authorized to use the construction management process and are requesting approval of preliminary plans for the project. The NH Marine Patrol provides life safety services to the public and we are attempting to limit the construction to one boating season. The tight time frame, the complexity of the project and environmental concerns are key factors guiding our decision to utilize a construction management (CM) delivery system for this project. The CM delivery system will allow us to prequalify the best vendors for the project based on qualifications, experience and team composition. It will also expedite the schedule and provide more flexibility to deal with any unforeseen conditions or schedule adjustments.

The bonds will be repaid by revenue from student room and board fees and other revenue associated with auxiliary (self-supporting) operations. The State does not guarantee NHHEFA bonds and is not liable for the payment of principal or interest on the bonds, nor is the State directly, indirectly or contingently obligated to levy or pledge any form of revenue whatsoever for such payments.

The purpose of the proposed bonds is to complete the construction of the above four projects at Plymouth State University, Keene State College and the University of New Hampshire as summarized on the attachments. The proposed projects and the issuance of the bonds have been approved by the USNH Board of Trustees. Summary information regarding these projects is attached and additional information will be provided at the Committee meeting.

AT THE UNIVERSITY OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

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Hamel Recreation Center, Board of Trustees Approved February 6, 2015

A \$35.5 million expansion of Hamel Recreation Center. This project is a 66,000 SF addition to the existing facility to provide expanded fitness and indoor play court area. Includes renovations to the existing recreation center facility to update building systems. This project will utilize \$29.5 million of HEFA funding, \$3.44 million Internal Fund Borrowing and \$2.56 million in campus reserves.

Holloway Commons, Board of Trustees Approved: April 18, 2014

A \$10.5 million renovation of Holloway Commons. This project is an 11,000 SF addition to increase seating capacity by 356 and includes selected renovations to the existing dining area to reduce congestion and improve circulation. This project will utilize \$10.5 million of HEFA funding.

AT PLYMOUTH STATE UNIVERSITY

ALLWell North, Board of Trustees Approved: October 24, 2013

A new \$32 million facility for PSU totalling approximately 112,000 SF. The project includes classrooms, an indoor field house incorporating a 200 meter NCAA competition track with related jumping and throwing event venues. The classroom space will support Health and Human Performance academic programming. This project will utilize \$8 million of HEFA funding, \$2 million State Capital Appropriation, \$16 million Internal Borrowing, \$4.5 million campus reserves and \$1.5 million in Grants/Gifts.

AT KEENE STATE COLLEGE

Pondside IV, Board of Trustees Approved: June 27, 2014 Amended: February 6, 2015

New \$33.5 million residence hall of approximately 81,500 SF. The project will provide 349 beds for first year students. It will also set a new standard for a living/learning community at KSC. It will have formal and informal learning areas including three classrooms. Energy efficient design elements include a geothermal system for hot water and public spaces. This project will utilize \$33 million of HEFA funding and \$500,000 from internal campus reserves.

# **Fleet Purchasing Process**

Chapter 143 Laws of 2013, 04-96-96-960515-30050000-030, footnote requires the Department to develop an Equipment Acquisition Plan and receive approval from both the Capital Budget Overview Committee and the Governor and Council before purchasing any new or replacement equipment. This Chapter also requires NHDOT, Bureau of Mechanical Services to submit a monthly status report of the plan to the Capital Budget Overview Committee and the Governor and Council. This document serves as the **October 2014**, Status Report.

The Department purchases replacement equipment and vehicles in five distinct and separate phases throughout a given fiscal year:

**Phase I - Approval Process**: The Department reviews the fleet to prioritize replacement needs considering equipment condition, age, and usage. Based on the needs identified and the available budget, the Department identifies the pieces to be replaced and prepares the Equipment Acquisition Plan. The Department then submits the plan to the Capital Budget Overview Committee and the Governor and Council for approval prior to expending Class 30 – Equipment New/Replacement funding as appropriated.

**Phase II - Bid & Award:** Once the Acquisition Plan is approved the Department works with Administrative Services to prepare a bid package that includes equipment and vehicle specifications and options. When the documents are complete Administrative Services advertises and receives bids, determines the low bidder and executes a notice of contract.

**Phase III - Financial Evaluation:** The Department compares the contract costs to the estimated costs. Minor quantity adjustments may be made to adjust for actual vs. estimated costs, equipment failure or other factors.

**Phase IV – Purchasing:** Purchasing is initiated based on the financial evaluation. Priority is given to purchasing the major units and equipment. Remaining funds may be used to purchase necessary miscellaneous shop equipment.

**Phase V - Reporting:** The Department submits this monthly status report to both the Capital Budget Overview Committee and the Governor and Council. The Attachment to this report shows items to be purchased, planned quantity, planned cost and the planned total that were shown and approved in the Equipment Acquisition Plan. The attachment also shows the actual purchased quantity, the actual bid price, the actual total cost and the date purchased.

### Fleet Purchasing Process

Chapter 143 Laws of 2013, 04-96-96-960515-30050000-030, footnote requires the Department to develop an Equipment Acquisition Plan and receive approval from both the Capital Budget Overview Committee and the Governor and Council before purchasing any new or replacement equipment. This Chapter also requires NHDOT, Bureau of Mechanical Services to submit a monthly status report of the plan to the Capital Budget Overview Committee and the Governor and Council. This document serves as the **November 2014**, Status Report.

The Department purchases replacement equipment and vehicles in five distinct and separate phases throughout a given fiscal year:

**Phase I - Approval Process:** The Department reviews the fleet to prioritize replacement needs considering equipment condition, age, and usage. Based on the needs identified and the available budget, the Department identifies the pieces to be replaced and prepares the Equipment Acquisition Plan. The Department then submits the plan to the Capital Budget Overview Committee and the Governor and Council for approval prior to expending Class 30 – Equipment New/Replacement funding as appropriated.

**Phase II - Bid & Award:** Once the Acquisition Plan is approved the Department works with Administrative Services to prepare a bid package that includes equipment and vehicle specifications and options. When the documents are complete Administrative Services advertises and receives bids, determines the low bidder and executes a notice of contract.

**Phase III - Financial Evaluation:** The Department compares the contract costs to the estimated costs. Minor quantity adjustments may be made to adjust for actual vs. estimated costs, equipment failure or other factors.

**Phase IV – Purchasing:** Purchasing is initiated based on the financial evaluation. Priority is given to purchasing the major units and equipment. Remaining funds may be used to purchase necessary miscellaneous shop equipment.

**Phase V - Reporting:** The Department submits this monthly status report to both the Capital Budget Overview Committee and the Governor and Council. The Attachment to this report shows items to be purchased, planned quantity, planned cost and the planned total that were shown and approved in the Equipment Acquisition Plan. The attachment also shows the actual purchased quantity, the actual bid price, the actual total cost and the date purchased.

In accordance with NH Laws of 2013, Chapter 195:1, IV, enclosed please find a copy of the January 2015 Quarterly Report for the Women's Prison project.

The Department of Administrative Services (DAS), Department of Corrections (DOC), SMRT and Gilbane Building Co. (Gilbane), have continued working together productively as the Design and Construction Team (Team). We are currently working on two fronts: final design documents for the buildings and finalizing construction of the site preparation. In both these areas, the team continues to seek the best value for the project as we work on reconciling estimates and budget. Although, we still face a budget challenge.

The facility's 90% Construction Document set was received on schedule (December 19th) and reviewed by DOC and DAS during the week of December 22nd for final feedback. This set was used as the basis for bidding, which commenced on December 29, 2014. These drawings represent the "Minimally Required Facility" that we believe meets the Department of Corrections' obligations to parity as expressed by NH Legal Assistance, operational efficiency and the effective treatment of New Hampshire's female offenders.

Site Preparation construction commenced (August 18) and by the time of this meeting will be 100% complete. The site preparation phase of the work has gone well. The total cost for Phase I site preparation work is slightly greater than anticipated, as outlined in the attached report. The bulk of this increase in cost is attributable to costs being transferred from Phase II to Phase I and is not a cost increase for the overall project.

We have the following steps to attain as we move into 2015: 1.) Receipt of finalized Construction Documents from SMRT by 1/30/2015; Women's Prison Quarterly Report ¹ December 31, 2014; Page 2

2.) Submit for the second of two required RSA 674.54 public meetings in January 2015;

3.) Facilitate the bid process that started on 12/29/2014; and

4.) Receipt of the Guaranteed Maximum Price #2 for the building and site from Gilbane on March 2, 2015.

Our current course of action positions the State to have a complete set of Construction Bid Documents, market pricing from those documents, a complete site pad and drainage work, stable and ready to receive a structure in the first quarter of 2015.

We wish to welcome the new Committee members and thank you for your attention to budget and critical path schedule issues; and your concern for the people of New Hampshire who will be well served by this important project.

We provide the following update for your review and use.

The Department of Administrative Services (DAS), Department of Corrections (DOC), SMRT and Gilbane Building Co. (Gilbane), have continued working together productively as the Design and Construction Team (Team). Currently the Team is working on two fronts: final design documents for the buildings and finalizing construction of the site preparation. On both of these fronts the team continues to seek the best value for the project as we work on reconciling estimates and budget. We still face a budget challenge.

Since the report in November, we have continued construction of the site preparation and finalizing the construction documents.

- 1. Site Preparation construction commenced (August 18) and by the time of this meeting will be 100% complete. The site preparation phase of the work has gone well. Although the site was rocky and steep; the bedrock depth was greater than expected for much of the site and the glacial till the site has yielded is useable material.
- 2. The total cost for phase I site preparation work is slightly greater than anticipated, as outlined below. The lion's share of this increase is cost that has been transferred from phase II to phase I and is not a cost increase for the overall project.
  - a. As we noted last report, some of the phase II work has been incorporated into this phase to manufacture a ready stockpile of select gravels (30,000 cubic yards) for use as structural fill at a much reduced cost. The overall cost was \$331,000.00 but the savings to crush the gravel now rather than import or crush in phase II is estimated at \$250,000.
  - b. A large change for phase I was the inclusion of the entire bond for the project of approximately \$244,000. This transfer of funds also included some minor corrections to costs of insurance.
  - c. Another cost added to phase I was emergency repair on the men's prison steam-lines. Steam-line work was scheduled to be part of phase II but due to an emergency situation the structure of the contract allowed some of the funding appropriated specifically for steam-line repair to be used to accomplish almost \$40,000 of repairs during phase I.

- d. As noted in the last report there have also been some additional costs to the project for unforeseen conditions encountered, required field changes and some minor design engineering changes.
- e. Please note that the Underground Storage Tank removal has been completed and funds remaining in that allocation total approximately \$69,000. If possible these should be re-allocated for use in the women's prison construction.

- 3. Construction Documents produced by SMRT are based on the 'Minimum Required Facility' (MRF). The MRF has been established based on existing legal and regulatory requirements, parity concerns as expressed by New Hampshire Legal Assistance (NHLA) and DOC requirements for operational efficiency and gender-responsive design. Every space, size and arrangement included has been deemed necessary to achieve 'parity' as required by the class action law suit filed by NHLA.
  - a. A 90% Construction Document set was submitted to DAS/Public Works and DOC on 12/19/2014.
  - b. DAS/Public Works and DOC are currently reviewing the 90% documents. Comments are due back to SMRT on 1/16/2015.

5. The Team continues to evaluate areas of the project where additional cost savings may be realized.

We are working toward the following goals as we begin 2015.

- 1. SMRT will finalize the Construction Documents by 1/30/2015 based on DAS/DOC comments and SMRT Quality Control review.
- 2. BPW, SMRT and DOC are scheduled to submit to the City of Concord for the second of two required RSA 674.54 public meetings in January of 2015 for the February 2015 meeting.
- 3. Bidding has started; the 90% drawings 'hit the street' on 12/29/2014. We will have a major addendum based on subcontractor questions and 100% documents about February 1. Major Sub-Contractor Bids are scheduled to be received by mid-February 2015. It will take a couple of weeks to level and finalize the bids. This will give an accurate picture of the exact scope of any overages.
- 4. Guaranteed Maximum Price#2 for the building and site will be delivered by Gilbane on March 2, 2015. The GMP/Bids based on the Construction Documents should provide a clearer budget picture of the overall project.

Our current course of action positions the State to have a complete set of Construction Bid Documents, market pricing from those documents, a complete site pad and drainage work, stable and ready to receive a structure in the first quarter of 2015.

We wish to welcome the new Committee members and thank the Committee for continued sensitivity and patience regarding the differences between the design-bid-build process and the Construction Management process. We also thank you for your attention to budget and critical path schedule issues; and your concern for the people of New Hampshire who will be well served by this important project.

**Phase V - Reporting:** The Department submits this monthly status report to both the Capital Budget Overview Committee and the Governor and Council. The Attachment to this report shows items to be purchased, planned quantity, planned cost and the planned total that were shown and approved in the Equipment Acquisition Plan. 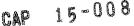

## **Fleet Purchasing Process**

Chapter 143 Laws of 2013, 04-96-96-960515-30050000-030, footnote requires the Department to develop an Equipment Acquisition Plan and receive approval from both the Capital Budget Overview Committee and the Governor and Council before purchasing any new or replacement equipment. This Chapter also requires NHDOT, Bureau of Mechanical Services to submit a monthly status report of the plan to the Capital Budget Overview Committee and the Governor and Council. This document serves as the **February 2015**, Status Report.

The Department purchases replacement equipment and vehicles in five distinct and separate phases throughout a given fiscal year:

**Phase I - Approval Process:** The Department reviews the fleet to prioritize replacement needs considering equipment condition, age, and usage. Based on the needs identified and the available budget, the Department identifies the pieces to be replaced and prepares the Equipment Acquisition Plan. The Department then submits the plan to the Capital Budget Overview Committee and the Governor and Council for approval prior to expending Class 30 – Equipment New/Replacement funding as appropriated.

**Phase II - Bid & Award:** Once the Acquisition Plan is approved the Department works with Administrative Services to prepare a bid package that includes equipment and vehicle specifications and options. When the documents are complete Administrative Services advertises and receives bids, determines the low bidder and executes a notice of contract.

**Phase III - Financial Evaluation:** The Department compares the contract costs to the estimated costs. Minor quantity adjustments may be made to adjust for actual vs. estimated costs, equipment failure or other factors.

**Phase IV – Purchasing:** Purchasing is initiated based on the financial evaluation. Priority is given to purchasing the major units and equipment. Remaining funds may be used to purchase necessary miscellaneous shop equipment.

**Phase V - Reporting:** The Department submits this monthly status report to both the Capital Budget Overview Committee and the Governor and Council. The Attachment to this report shows items to be purchased, planned quantity, planned cost and the planned total that were shown and approved in the Equipment Acquisition Plan. The attachment also shows the actual purchased quantity, the actual bid price, the actual total cost and the date purchased.

**Amendments:** Based on actual expenditures and available funding mechanisms, any significant change to the approved plan will be submitted as an amendment to be approved by the Capital Budget Overview Committee and Governor and Council.
